

**Minutes of the 7<sup>th</sup> State Level Technical Committee (SLTC) of Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) held on 16<sup>th</sup> June 2017 at 12.00 noon in the Chamber of Principal Secretary, Local Self Government Department, Government of Kerala.**

The meeting of State Level Technical Committee commenced at 12.00 noon in the Chamber of Principal Secretary, Local Self Government Department.

**1. Agenda :Approval of the Minutes of 6<sup>th</sup> SLTC meeting**

SLTC approved the minutes of the 6<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2017.

**2. Agenda: Action taken report on the decisions of 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of SLTC**

**2.1. Utilisation of Reform incentive**

State has received an incentive of Rs 15 Cr from MoUD for achieving the reform milestones for 2015-16. The 6<sup>th</sup> State Level Technical Committee had decided to retain an amount of Rs. 3.00 Cr at the State Mission Directorate and to utilize the amount for various feasibility studies. The remaining, Rs.12.00 Cr may be distributed among the Mission cities based on their performance in achieving the reform milestones (40%), population (30%) and project allocation (30%).

**2.2.1 Action taken**

The decisions of SLTC were discussed in the 9<sup>th</sup> SHPSC held on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2017. However the SHPSC decided to defer and adjourn this agenda to the next SHPSC meeting.

## 2.2. Sewerage / Septage management projects, SAAP 2017-18

The Chairman directed the Mission Director to assess the feasibility of all proposed projects under Sewerage/ Septage Management sector for SAAP 2017-18 & the list of approved projects under SAAP 2015-16 & 2016-17.

### 2.2.1 Action taken

The projects proposed under Sewerage/Septage Management sector were reviewed and projects were finalized by the Mission Director. Further, the third SAAP was submitted to MoUD for an amount worth Rs 973.64 Cr on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2017 with the approval of the Chairman SHPSC

## 2.3. Selection of consultants

SLTC decided that the Mission cities have to select consultants for DPR preparation from government empanelled agencies through competitive bidding process, giving due weightage for quality and past experience.

### 2.3.1 Action taken

The Mission Director issued directions to all the Mission Cities to expedite the DPR preparation within July 31st 2017. The status of DPR preparation process is given below.

## 2.4 Desalination plant in Guruvayur

Upon the request of the Guruvayur Municipal Corporation, the SLTC decided to construct a desalination plant in EPC mode to address the water shortage problem in the town.

### 2.4.1 Action taken

It is informed from Guruvayur Municipality that, SCMS College of Engineering & Technology, Karukutty was selected for conducting a feasibility Study of a 10 MLD desalination Plant, and the process has been approved by the Municipal Council for an amount of Rs. 7.8 Lakh.

## 2.5. Engaging KMRL in Urban Transport

KMRL has expressed their willingness to provide end to end support in Urban Transport and Open Spaces & Parks sector. However, representatives from the Mission cities opined that the rate quoted by the KMRL is on higher side. Hence SLTC decided to give the choice to mission cities to select the consultant.

### 2.5.1 Action taken

The agenda was put up in the 9th SHPSC held on 9.05.2017. SHPSC discussed about engaging KMRL by Mission cities for support in Urban Transport and Open spaces & parks sectors. But the agenda was deferred to the next SHPSC meeting for want of more information on the earlier decisions in this regard by the SHPSC and SLTC.

## 2.6. HR support to KWA

KWA was requested to forward a proposal for HR support with their requirements and SMMU team to explore the possibilities of meeting the expenses for the same under PDMC component of A&OE. Subsequently, Kerala Water Authority (KWA) has submitted a proposal to the Mission Director and further details in point no 8.

The SLTC took note of the actions taken against the decision of 6<sup>th</sup> SLTC

### 3. PROJECT STATUS –AMRUT

The Mission Director informed that the 3 SAAPs has been approved by MoUD for an amount of Rs2357.7 Cr and shared the progress of project as

SLTC reviewed all projects in detail, the committee assessed the need of each project, its components, unit cost, funding pattern, strategies for Operation & Maintenance etc. Comments of the SLTC are enclosed as *Annexure 1*. The committee decided to recommend all the projects for the consideration of State High Powered Steering Committee (SHPS). As per the 9<sup>th</sup> SHPS decision, these projects have to be placed through the working Group mechanism also before issuing the Government Order. The committee also directed the representatives from mission cities to update DPRs to include the suggestions of SLTC before forwarding the reports to SHPS.

## 6. AMRUT REFORMS 2016-17

The Mission envisages improving governance through a set of Reforms. For 2016-17, Mission Director, has forwarded the self assessed score card of reform milestones along with all supporting documents on 29th April 2017. Three of the milestones require policy level decision and they are establishment of Municipal Cadre, Appointment of internal auditor and Adoption of Model Building By-Laws- 201.

## 7. TECHNICAL SANCTION OF PROJECTS -WATER SUPPLY

Kerala Water Authority (KWA) vide letter No. KWA/JP/P-III/37/2017 dated 3/06/2017 has requested the Mission Director for a change in procedure adopted for according Technical Sanction of water supply projects under AMRUT. The present procedure of according TS through sector wise Technical Committees constituted for the purpose is resulting in process delay. Also, KWA already have an established mechanism to scrutinize project proposals and the Chief engineers of KWA are having unlimited powers for issuing TS in respect of projects taken up under various funding agencies. In this context, the KWA has requested to adopt the ongoing procedures of KWA to issue TS for water supply projects under AMRUT. Smt Tinku Biswal, Secretary (Water Resources) expressed her concern over the process delay and time delay in obtaining TS through Technical committee.

SLTC had deliberations on various procedures adopted to issue TS in projects entrusted to KWA and decided to follow the ongoing procedures of KWA for issuing the TS for all projects under Water supply and Sewerage sector for which DPRs are prepared by KWA .

## 8. HR support to Kerala Water Authority (KWA)

### 8.1 Consultancy fee for DPR preparation

Managing Director, KWA submitted a request to Mission Director requesting a consultancy fee at the rate of 2.5% of the project cost for DPR preparation. The SLTC pointed out that the assets created under AMRUT would be owned by KWA and also 100% project cost is also given as grant to KWA. In this context, SLTC decided not to give any consultancy fee for preparing DPRs

but to reimburse cost on actuals upon the submission of bills for all types of surveys carried out during DPR preparation.

## 8.2. Developing web based Project Monitoring portal

Managing Director, KWA submitted a request letter to Mission Director asking for Rs. 33.25 lakhs to setup a separate core group with a dedicated web based monitoring and reporting programme. The core group will have 3 technical personnel with degree in computer science/computer application) capable of updating, reviewing, maintaining and consolidating data collected / received through the web based programme. With a cost of Rs. 9.75 lakhs per year for the next three years and a contingency of Rs. 4 lakhs, the proposal totals to Rs.33.25 lakhs. .

The SLTC discussed the proposal submitted by KWA in detail and decided to approve the proposal for developing a web based Project Monitoring portal at the cost of Rs 33.25 lakh. The SLTC directed the Mission Director to give necessary support to KWA in this regard.
