SLTC Recommendation:

The Committee directed the ULBs to take necessary actions in line with the decisions taken by the Apex Committee of MoHUA.

Deliberation:

- ❖ The Committee noted that the progress achieved by Kollam and Kozhikode Corporation is poor.
- ❖ The Secretary, Kozhikode Corporation informed that the progress achieved is less because major amount is set aside for sewerage projects proposed at Avikkal and Kothi which are held up. The sewerage project proposed at Kothi is held up due to the delay in obtaining judgment from the Hon' High Court. The sewerage project proposed at Avikkal is held up due to the changes required in design. The revised design has been given to Govt. Engg. College, Thrissur for vetting. A case is also ongoing in the Civil Court regarding the Avikkal project.

- ❖ The Additional Chief Secretary, LSGD informed that the Advocate General has been already contacted with regard to the Kothi project. The design changes proposed at Avikkal are required due to the changes made in the STP layout plan as per the latest KSPCB stipulations.
- ❖ The Chief Secretary opined that if there is delay in obtaining decision from Courts the concerned ULB should inform the Chief Secretary's Office in writing so that the matter can be taken up with the Advocate General.
- ❖ The Chief Secretary added that the District Collectors have to be made Nodal Officer for AMRUT projects so that the execution of projects can be expedited.
- ❖ The Secretary, Kollam Corporation informed that the progress achieved is less because major amount is set aside for a sewerage project and a water supply project which are not yet awarded. The water supply project is the weir proposed across Kallada River at Njankadavu and the same is held up because estimate revision is required due to change in design. The estimate was prepared by Irrigation Dept. The sewer network project was split by KWA into smaller packages and tendered but no bids were received.
- ❖ The Chief Secretary opined that the ULB has to initiate action against the officials who prepared the faulty design of the weir.
- ❖ The Managing Director, KWA informed that the KWA has prepared the estimate as per DSR but due to narrow roads, depth of sewer pipe laying and type of soil strata, additional shoring will have to be provided which is not there in the estimate. Because of this either no bids are received or bids with huge tender excess are received.
- ❖ The Deputy Chief Engineer, KWA informed that the estimate is being revised by incorporating trenchless technology. Initially trenchless technology was not considered because it was costly and contractors who can execute the work were not available. Recently many contractors have come forward for executing works involving trenchless technology. Hence, KWA has decided to revise the estimate incorporating the same.
- ❖ The Chief Secretary opined that proper guidelines have to be given by KWA for preparing estimate for sewerage works along narrow roads.
- ❖ The Managing Director KWA informed that the KWA has been associating with KIIFB recently for implementing modern technologies with regard to sewerage works and action is being taken against officials whose performance is poor.
- ❖ The Vice Chairman, Palakkad Municipality informed that the Municipal Engineer was posted in the ULB only in July after a delay of nearly 6 months. In order to successfully complete the ongoing projects more engineering staffs are required to be posted in the ULB. The posts for Executive Engineer and Assistant Engineer are vacant. Out of the ULB's requirement of 5 Assistant Engineers only 2 are available at present. Sufficient numbers of overseers are also not available in the ULB.
- ❖ The Chief Secretary informed that the matter is being looked into by the Govt. and more engineering staffs will be provided soon.

Decision: The Committee took note of the progress achieved and directed as follows:

- ❖ Necessary actions shall be taken by the ULB and KWA to expedite the progress of works.
- ❖ If there is delay in obtaining decision from Courts the concerned ULBs shall inform the Chief Secretary's Office in writing so that the matter can be taken up with the Advocate General.
- ❖ District Collectors shall be made Nodal Officer for AMRUT projects for expediting the execution.
- ❖ Action shall be initiated against the officials who prepared the faulty weir design of Kollam.

Agenda Item No.4: GENERAL

Agenda Item No.4.1: Cancellation of AMRUT Works That Cannot be Started Before 31.03.2023 & Reallocation to New Sewerage & Septage Proposals:

Fifteen AMRUT projects (Rs.68.28 Cr.) of various sectors are not likely to be started before 31.03.2023 (*List of projects attached as Annexure-2*). The MoHUA has directed to drop such projects. The fund allocated to such projects may be reallocated to the new sewerage proposals prepared by KWA in AMRUT-1.0 cities which can be started by 31.12.2022.

The Managing Director, KWA had informed in the 25th SLTC of AMRUT-1.0 held on 22.09.2022 that the Preliminary Engineering Reports are ready for new sewerage proposals worth Rs.49.91 Cr. in Thiruvananthapuram Corporation. The fund available due to cancellation of the projects can be utilized for the new sewerage proposals of KWA in Thiruvananthapuram Corporation.

In the case of the Urban Transport sector works (MLCP – Rs.10.91 Cr.) to be dropped in the case of Kollam the amount is proposed to be utilized for the sewerage work in Kollam.

SLTC Recommendation:

The Committee decided to recommend the following to SHPSC:

- ❖ Cancel projects that are not likely to be started/ restarted by 31.03.2023.
- ❖ Reallocate Rs.49.91 Cr. from the cancelled projects to sewer network works planned by KWA in Thiruvananthapuram Corporation that can be started soon and can achieve at least 30% physical progress by 31.03.2023.
- ❖ For the balance amount (Rs.7.46 Cr.) the possibility of taking up and starting FSTP projects may be checked.

Decision: The Committee decided as follows:

- ❖ Cancel projects that are not likely to be started/ restarted by 31.03.2023.
- ❖ Reallocate Rs.50 Cr. from the cancelled projects to sewer network works planned by KWA in Thiruvananthapuram Corporation that can be started soon and can achieve at least 30% physical progress by 31.03.2023.
- ❖ For the balance amount (Rs.7.37 Cr.) the possibility of taking up and starting FSTP projects shall be checked.

Agenda Item No.4.2: Reconstitution of the Technical Committee for Sewerage & Septage Sector Works of AMRUT-1.0:

The Mission Director requested the 5th SLTC of AMRUT-2.0 that the Director of Urban Affairs is the Chairman of the Technical Committee constituted for the Sewerage & Septage sector projects of AMRUT. Since the Technical Committee is reviewing technical matters and since the Mission Director, AMRUT and the Director Urban Affairs being the same person, the Mission Director requested to exclude the Director of Urban Affairs from the Technical Committee and reconstitute the Committee with the Technical Member, KWA as the Chairman.

The Secretary, Kollam Corporation, vide Letter No. CSSS1/ 48036/15 dated 30.08.2022 informed as follows and requested to obtain the approvals of SLTC & SHPSC. The agreement for the subject work was not executed since the land was not in Corporation's possession. The project was proposed at a 'Revenue Puramboke' land located opposite to the Kollam railway station which was a slum of 24 families who were doing 'cloth washing as their conventional job there. The Kollam Municipal Corporation planned and executed a rehabilitation project for these 24 families, finding a land at Mundakkal area and constructing separate houses for these families in 3 cents each. 20 families were rehabilitated to the new housing project but the remaining 4 were not willing to shift from there and went for legal cases against the Kollam Municipal Corporation and the District Collector, to the Hon. High Court and District Munsiff Court claiming that they have ownership on the land where they are residing. The District Collector submitted statement of facts in the Hon High Court after detailed departmental enquiry, stating that the petitioners have no right on the land, the documents produced by the petitioners are invalid and to requested for ordering to evict them from there for starting the project. The AMRUT project period ends by March 2023 and an amount of Rs.10.91 Cr. allocated could be lost if this project can't be completed before March 2023. In the meeting chaired by the ACS, LSGD on 12.08.2022 Kollam Corporation has been advised to take necessary action to cancel the project and reallocate the fund to sewerage sector projects since more time is required to resolve the line and the possibility of completing the project within the stipulated time is very less.

The cancellation of the project Multi Level Car Parking (MLCP) near railway station results in savings of an amount of Rs.10.91 Cr. This savings may be allowed to be transferred for the project “Construction of Balance Sewerage Network and Pumping Stations in Kollam Corporation”.

As per the decision of the 27th SHPSC, vide G.O (Rt) No. 1298/ 2021/ LSGD dated 09.07.2021, AS was issued for the project “Construction of Balance Sewerage Network and Pumping Stations” for an amount of Rs.93.612 Cr. subject to the condition that an amount of Rs.40.072 Cr. has to be borne by the ULB.

The 30th SHPSC, decided to transfer the savings of Rs.6.539 Cr. from the completed works of AMRUT to sewerage sector work namely "Construction of balance Sewerage Network and Pumping Stations in Kollam Corporation" and G.O (Rt) No. 1950/2022/ LSGD dated 11.08.2022 was issued accordingly.

The ULB would like to cancel the MLCP project (Rs.10.91Cr.) and reallocate the amount to the sewerage sector project, "Construction of Balance Sewerage Network and Pumping Stations in Kollam Corporation" so that the Corporation's liability for the sewerage project would be reduced from Rs.33.533 Cr. to Rs.22.623 Cr.

SLTC Recommendation:

The Committee decided to recommend the cancellation of the project, "Multi Level Car Parking (MLCP)" under Urban Transport Sector and reallocation of the saving of Rs.10.91 Cr. to the project, "Construction of Balance Sewerage Network and Pumping Stations in Kollam Corporation" under Sewerage Sector, to the SHPSC, subject to the following conditions:

- ❖ Any financial implications due to non-completion of the sewerage project by 31.03.2023 shall be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ The approval of the Council shall be obtained.

Decision: The Committee decided to accord sanction to cancel the project, "Multi Level Car Parking (MLCP)", under Urban Transport Sector and to reallocate the saving of Rs.10.91 Cr. to the project, "Construction of Balance Sewerage Network and Pumping Stations in Kollam Corporation", under Sewerage Sector so that the liability of the ULB can be reduced, subject to the following conditions:

- ❖ Any financial implications due to non-completion of the sewerage project by 31.03.2023 shall be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ The approval of the Council shall be obtained.

SLTC Recommendation:

The Committee decided to recommend the revision of Administrative Sanction of the project “Sewerage Treatment Plant, 360 KLD Capacity, General Hospital, Thrissur” from Rs.3.52 Cr. to Rs.4.50 Cr., to the SHPSC subject to the following conditions:

- ❖ The excess amount of Rs.0.98 Cr. shall be met by the ULB from the Urban Agglomeration Fund of Rs.1 Cr. or from the own fund of the ULB.
- ❖ Any financial implications due to non-completion of the work by 31.03.2023 shall be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ Approval of the Council shall be obtained for cancelling the original Technical Sanction at the earliest and the same to be provided to the Chief Engineer, LSGD for issuing revised Technical Sanction.

Deliberation:

- ❖ The Additional Chief Secretary, Finance Dept. informed as follows:
The ULBs may not be able to bear the financial burden in case the newly taken up works or spill over works are not completed by Mar-2023 and the MoHUA stops the funding. From previous experience such financial burden has fallen on the State.
- ❖ The Mission Director, AMRUT informed that the MoHUA is expected to keep on funding the project if at least 10% physical progress is achieved by Mar-2023. In case the funding is stopped the ULBs will have to bear the financial burden.
- ❖ The Additional Chief Secretary, Finance Dept. informed that if at least 10% physical completion is achieved the MoHUA may consider the continuation of the funding from AMRUT-2.0.
- ❖ The Additional Chief Secretary, LSGD informed that the ULBs are willing to bear the financial burden in case the MoHUA stops funding for projects after Mar-2023.
- ❖ The Chief Secretary opined that the ULBs may be allowed to go ahead with the projects if commitment is given by them to bear the financial burden in case the funding is stopped by MoHUA. The Chief Secretary added that the projects will have to be reviewed frequently.
- ❖ The Mission Director, AMRUT informed that the projects that are unlikely to be completed by Mar-2023 have been identified.

Agenda Item No.6.3: Guruvayur Municipality – Sewerage & Septage Sector – Cancellation of the Septage Treatment Plant Proposed at Chakkamkandam – Decisions Requested by the ULB:

The 30th SHPSC held on 05.07.2022 directed to cancel the septage treatment plant proposed under AMRUT at Chakkamkandam as the proposed land is falling under the Wet Land category and KWA had taken up the project for co-treatment of septage in the existing 3 MLD STP at Chakkamkandam under Rebuild Kerala Initiative (RKI) which rendered the septage plant under AMRUT redundant.

Vide Letter No. E.5-5062/ 22 dated 02.09.2022, the Secretary, Guruvayur informed that the Council held on 30.08.2022 has not agreed to cancel the septage treatment plant work for want of the following decisions and requested to place the matter in the SLTC / SHPSC:

- (a) Decision on who will bear the expense incurred for the work so far.
- (b) Decision on the fund to be utilized for buying septage vehicles & related equipment.

SLTC Recommendation:

The Committee decided to recommend the following to the SHPSC:

- ❖ The amount set aside in the DPR for collection & conveyance of septage of Rs.0.50 Cr. shall be kept intact and the balance amount of Rs.4 Cr. shall be transferred to the new sewerage / septage proposals.
- ❖ The expense incurred so far for the septage project shall be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ The District Collector shall report the persons responsible for the selection of an unsuitable land for the septage plant project.

Deliberation:

- ❖ The Mission Director informed as follows:

The septage plant project has been included in the list of projects to be cancelled due to land related issues and it became redundant when the septage co-treatment work was taken up by KWA as separate project under RKI. The ULB has requested for decisions regarding the purchase of septage collection & conveyance vehicles and regarding the funding for the expense incurred so far.

- ❖ The Additional Chief Secretary, LSGD informed as follows:

The ULB had to appoint an agency to prepare the DPR of the project as the KWA was not willing to do the DPR preparation at that time. Now the DPR has become infructuous as the ULB could not go ahead with the work. KWA has taken up the septage co-treatment work as per the decision taken at the Govt. level. Hence the ULB cannot be blamed for the infructuous DPR.

- ❖ The Managing Director, KWA informed as follows:

The land identified for the ULB's septage plant project was falling under wet land category and the Village Officer issued a stop memo when the work was started. The septage co-treatment work was taken up by the KWA when the ULB requested permission for constructing the septage plant on the KWA land inside the existing STP premises at Chakkamkandam.

Decision: **The Committee decided to accord sanction to cancel the work, “Septage Treatment Plant at Chakkamkandam”, subject to the following conditions:**

- ❖ The amount of Rs.0.50 Cr. set aside in the DPR for the collection & conveyance of septage shall be utilized for the purchase of septage vehicles for the ULB.
- ❖ The balance amount of Rs.4 Cr. shall be transferred to the new sewerage / septage proposals in other ULBs.
- ❖ The expense incurred so far for the septage project shall be borne by the ULB.
- ❖ The District Collector shall report the persons responsible for the selection of an unsuitable land for the septage plant project.

Agenda Item No.6.4: Kozhikode Corporation – Sewerage & Septage Sector – Decentralized Sewerage System for Zone-A, Package-A & B – Permission Requested by the ULB Regarding Commencement of Sewer Pipe Laying Works:

Initially the project was tendered as two works, Zone-A, Package-A (7 MLD STP & 48 Km sewer network & ancillary works) and Zone-A, Package-B 6 MLD STP & 50 Km sewer network & ancillary works). Since the bid received in the tender done on 10.07.2019 for Package-A & Package-B were with very high tender excesses of 53.27% & 54.17% above Tendered Probable Amount of Contract (TPAC) respectively for Package-A & Package-B, SMMU had recommended the following to the Additional Chief Secretary, LSGD (vide Letter No.14/ 2015/ AMRUT/ Kozhikode dated 21.01.2020 and to the Secretary, Kozhikode Corporation (vide Letter No.14/ 2015/ AMRUT/ Kozhikode dated 23.01.2020.

- Retender the works to get better rates.
- Splitting of the work as 1) STP & 2) Sewer network with ancillary works.
- STP construction can be started first to ensure that plant work progresses and then network portions can be tendered to avoid purchase of pipes in beginning itself or just laying of pipes alone happening.

The 23rd SHPSC held on 04.02.2020, directed the ULB to retender the work. The ULB retendered the works on 20.02.2020 without splitting STP & network as separate works and the bids obtained were again having high tender excess (52.82% & 54.15% above TPAC respectively for Package-A & Package-B). The matter was placed in the 24th SHPSC held on 27.05.2020 for approval in which SMMU made the same above-mentioned recommendations to the SHPSC and the SHPSC directed the ULB to negotiate again with the bidder, obtain detailed rate analysis for the items quoted with rates much higher than local market rate and submit a comparison statement with justification.

Based on the letter sent from SMMU to the Additional Chief Secretary, LSGD, referred above, the Principal Secretary, LSGD vide letter dated 04.09.2020 had directed the ULB to retender the work and follow the recommendations of SMMU. Even though the ULB split the STP & network as separate works (four works - 7 MLD STP, 48 Km network, 6 MLD STP & 50 Km network) they tendered the STP & network works simultaneously. Subsequently, the bids obtained (7 MLD STP – 0.89% below TPAC, 48 Km network – 30% above TPAC, 6 MLD STP – 0.7% below TPAC & 50 Km network – 30% above TPAC) were approved by the 27th SHPSC held on 20.02.2021. The ULB then awarded the works to M/s.Seamak Hitech Products, Maharashtra (7 MLD & 6 MLD STPs) and M/s.Nasit Infrastructure, Ahmedabad, Gujarat (48 Km network & 50 Km network). Due to public protest and ongoing court cases only preliminary works have been done in the case of STP works so far and the sewer network works have not been started.

The Contractor of the sewer network works, M/s.Nasit Infrastructure informed vide Letter No. KRL/ 2022/ KzKD/ Comm/ 034 dated 14.07.2022 that the ULB has not given clearance for starting the sewer pipe laying works and the payment for the pipe supplied (sewer network related to 7 MLD) so far by them is pending with the ULB for nearly 9 months. They have also requested to implement price escalation and to return the security deposit in case the future of the project is unknown to the authorities.

As all AMRUT-1.0 works have to be completed by 31.03.2023, failing which, financial assistance may not be provided by the MoHUA and the ULB will have to utilize own funds to complete the works, the ULB was directed vide Letter No. SMMU/ 34/ 2022-UP2 dated 18.07.2022 to take necessary action to start the works at the earliest.

The Superintending Engineer, Kozhikode Corporation informed vide Letter No. EG21/ 43164/ 21 dated 12.09.2022 the ULB has not given permission to supply or unload pipes and requested permission to start the network laying works. It was also informed that the price escalation cannot be recommended as the quoted rate is higher than the present market rate and that the ULB is proceeding with the implementation of STP works.

SLTC Recommendation:

The Committee directed the Engineering Wing of the ULB to discuss the possibility of shifting the STPs and networks to Sarovaram area with the PPD unit of KWA in Kozhikode and inform the details in the next SLTC for taking an appropriate decision.

Deliberation:

- ❖ The Chief Secretary informed as follows:

The sewerage projects are unlikely to be started by Mar-2023 due to various issues. So in order to avoid the loss of fund for the State the possibility of cancelling the projects and transferring the money to other ULBs for taking up projects may be checked.

- ❖ The Hon' Mayor of Kozhikode informed as follows:

The possibility of shifting the STPs & network to Sarovaram area was discussed with the KWA and according to them the same is not feasible due to practical difficulties. Moreover the sewerage proposal given by KWA for implementing STP and network in Sarovaram area has been taken up by the ULB under AMRUT-2.0. The ULB is taking necessary efforts to start the STP works. Hence, a timeframe of 1.5 months may be given to the ULB to make a final effort to start the STP works. Main issues regarding the implementation of the sewerage projects are public protest and delays in obtaining judgment from the courts. Proper support is lacking from other political parties with regard to implementation of sewerage projects.

- ❖ The Chief Secretary opined as follows:

It is not appropriate to start sewer network works unless the STP works are started. The ULB shall check the possibility of keeping the STP works alone under AMRUT-1.0 and shifting the network works to AMRUT-2.0. The ULB needs to do more IEC activities to increase the awareness of the public with regard to the necessity of sewerage projects. Proper legal action has to be taken by the District Administration against the protestors.

Decision: The Committee decided as follows:

- ❖ A timeframe of 1.5 months (up to 11.12.2022) shall be given to the ULB to make a final effort to start the works related to the 6 MLD & 7 MLD STPs. The sewer pipe laying works shall not be started unless the STP works are started.
- ❖ If the ULB is able to start the STP works within the timeframe the STP works shall be maintained under AMRUT-1.0. The possibility of maintaining the sewer network works under AMRUT-1.0 or the possibility of cancelling the sewer network work and shifting the same to AMRUT-2.0 shall be checked and the suitable option shall be adopted.
- ❖ If the ULB is unable to start the STP works within the timeframe the STP works and sewer network works shall be cancelled and the available fund may be transferred to feasible projects in the same ULB or other ULBs that can be started soon and at least 10% physical progress can be achieved by Mar-2023.

The Superintending Engineer, LSGD, Kozhikode had requested in the 24th SLTC held on 20.06.2022 (Additional Agenda No.3) that the available savings in various sectors of AMRUT works in the ULB may be allowed to be transferred to the AMRUT work, "Decentralized Sewage Treatment Plants and Associated Sewerage Network for Zone-A in Kozhikode Corporation" (Zone-A, Package-A: 7 MLD STP at Avikkal Thodu & associated network and Zone-A, Package-B: 6 MLD STP at Kothi & associated network) so that the liability of the ULB in this work can be reduced.

The Council held on 30.08.2022 vide Resolution No.80.EG21/ 91939/ 15, approved the transfer of the total

savings of Rs.22.73 Cr. from the following sectors to the sewerage work, “Decentralized Sewage Treatment Plants and Associated Sewerage Network for Zone-A in Kozhikode Corporation”:

- Savings available in Water Supply Sector – Rs.18.10 Cr.
- Savings available in Storm Water Drainage Sector – Rs.3.29 Cr.
- Savings available in Urban Transport Sector – Rs.0.49 Cr.
- Savings available in Park Sector – Rs.0.85 Cr.

Total – Rs.22.73 Cr.

The 27th SHPSC had approved the revision of AS of the work (due to tender excess for STP works) from Rs.116.5 Cr. to Rs.140 Cr. subject to the condition that the 50% of the tender excess amount of Rs.23.5 Cr. that is Rs.11.75 Cr. will be met by the ULB and the balance amount will be met by the State.

By transferring the above-mentioned savings the liability of the ULB & State for the work can be reduced as follows:

- ULB Share of the Savings = 20% x Rs.22.73 Cr. = Rs.4.546 Cr.
- ULB’s Liability will be reduced to = Rs.11.75 Cr. – Rs.4.456 Cr. = **Rs.7.204 Cr.**


