The projects shown in the list above are proposed to be cancelled from AMRUT-1.0.

The total approved SAAP Cost for AMRUT-1.0 projects is Rs.2357.69 Cr. but the approved Central Assistance for AMRUT-1.0 projects is Rs.1161.20 Cr. Hence, under AMRUT-1.0, projects worth Rs.2322.40 Cr. can be taken up. The anticipated amount required for the projects (Annexure-3) taken up so far is Rs.2070.38 Cr. (excluding the above-mentioned projects to be cancelled). Hence projects worth Rs.252.02 Cr. can be taken up for fully utilizing the funds available under AMRUT-1.0.

Under AMRUT-1.0, the fund sharing for the ULBs is in the ratio 50% - Central: 30% - State: 20% - ULB, whereas, the fund sharing for AMRUT-1.0 ULBs, except Guruvayur, under AMRUT-2.0 is in the ratio 1/3rd - Central: 1/3rd - State: 1/3rd - ULB. Hence, the transfer of projects from AMRUT-2.0 to AMRUT-1.0 will be beneficial to the AMRUT-1.0 ULBs.

The works shown in the list below were placed in the 30th SLTC for approval for transfer to AMRUT-1.0 from AMRUT-2.0 as per the information received verbally from MoHUA that a period of two years from 31.03.2024 will be given for submission of utilization certificates for ongoing works.

30th SLTC Decision:

The Committee took note of the progress and directed the implementing agencies to expedite the completion of works and payment of bills so that maximum funds could be utilized by Mar-2024. The Committee decided to recommend the following to the SHPSC:

The Vice Chairman, Alappuzha Municipality, informed that the ULB will take necessary action to complete the proposed 5 works by March-2024.

Decision:

Additional Agenda Item No.35.AA.2: Release of 5th Installment of SAAP-I, SAAP-II & SAAP-III:

The release of 5th Installment of SAAP is based on the utilization of minimum 75% of fund released for each SAAP with a total minimum of 75% of the overall SAAPs. As per the OM K-16015/2018-AMRUT-1B dated 06.02.2018, a set of documents are required for the release of 5th installment of Central assistance under SAAPs.

MoHUA had released an amount of Rs. 232.24 Cr to the State as mobilization advance against SAAP I, II & III. MoHUA had released the following amounts against awarded projects of all SAAPs, Rs.194.74 Cr as 2nd installment, Rs.399.25 Cr as 3rd installment and Rs.119.62 Cr as 4th installment (SAAP I & III) with a total Central share of Rs. 945.85 Cr for all SAAPs.

The table below illustrates the State's eligibility to claim the 5th installment of all three SAAPs. As stipulated by MoHUA for claiming the release for the 5th installment, the State has achieved more than 75% of all the SAAP releases taken together.

The SHPSC may note that the State has utilized an amount of Rs. 1681.68 Cr (88.90%) against the total amount released. Based on the utilization, SHPSC may recommend the proposal for the claim of 5th installment of all SAAPs (Rs. 215.35 Cr.) for onward submission to MoHUA for their further action.

Decision:

The Committee approved the submission of maximum possible claim to MoHUA for the release of 5th installment of all SAAPs.

Additional Agenda Item No.35.AA.3: Thrissur Corporation – SEW Sector – Request to Revoke the Decision to Cancel a Work:

Additional Agenda Item No.35.AA.4: Kannur Corporation – UT Sector – Request to Execute Excess Works & Additional Works:

The Superintending Engineer, Kannur Corporation, requested the committee to allow the ULB to

execute civil work quantity exceeding 25% at DSR-2018 rate and additional electrical work at DSR-2018 rate of the work, "Multi Level Car Parking (MLCP) at Stadium Premises and Bank Road" and informed as follows:

- ❖ The works are necessary for the successful completion of the MLCPs
- ❖ All works can be completed by Mar-2024.
