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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign, launched by AMRUT Mission under the Local Self Government Department, Government of Kerala with the support of the National Service Scheme (NSS) under the Directorate of General Education, was a state-wide initiative aimed at fostering awareness and action on water conservation, sanitation, and sustainable water management. The campaign was designed to engage a wide spectrum of stakeholders, ranging from school students to the public, and to instill a sense of responsibility towards the protection of water resources and apt waste management inclusive of both solid and liquid waste management.

The campaign was a response to the increasing demand for water and sanitation solutions, exacerbated by rapid urbanization and climate change. By engaging students, teachers, and community members, the campaign sought to raise public consciousness about the importance of protecting water resources for present and future generations. Through activities such as water parliamentary sessions, public rallies, street plays, and message processions, the initiative highlighted sustainable practices and the role of the community as a major stakeholder in preserving water.

Central to the campaign’s success was its ability to engage youth in meaningful ways. The water parliamentary sessions provided students with a platform to discuss water-related challenges, while street plays and rallies offered creative outputs and outcome for advocacy. These activities not only educated participants but also inspired them to become active change agents in their communities. The public oath-taking ceremonies reinforced the message of collective action, as participants made a public commitment to water conservation and safer sanitation.

The “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign’s implementation was a collaborative effort involving diverse stakeholders, including NSS officers, local authorities, community leaders and more of all the students community. This broad partnership ensured the campaign reached urban and suburban areas across Kerala, creating a ripple effect of awareness and knowledge building. 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INTRODUCTION

Background

Jalam Jeevitham is an IEC (Information, Education and Communication) campaign organized by Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation 2.0(AMRUT 2.0), Local Self Government Department, Government of Kerala for disseminating awareness on conservation of water resources and promotion of sanitation (Solid and Liquid waste Management) among student's community and General public through National Service Scheme Volunteers (NSS) of various schools spread across 93 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) in the state of Kerala.

The Jalam Jeevitham Phase 1 was a 'Campus-to-Campus campaign' in the year 2023 through NSS student volunteers. This Campaign focused on spreading awareness about conserving water resources in every day's life among school children and enabled them to understand the need for every drop of water saved in day-to-day activities. A specifically designed study and training materials have been prepared for the best understanding of the school kids and community at large. Also, various other awareness campaign on Water Conservation & proper Sanitation promotion at schools were also conducted. The various activities promoted in schools are formation of "Eco clubs", Science clubs etc and students were encouraged to submit projects on water conservation in Schools and Houses, water quality testing, water quality auditing, through various level of competitions. This has enhanced the knowledge spread and awareness among student community and their families and also the general public. Various level of Campaign on water and sanitation were done in 342 schools spread across 93 ULBs of Kerala. A wide range of campaign activities such as drama & puppet shows, fixing message mirrors, signing campaigns, Water conservation related measures, promotion of prompt solid and liquid waste management systems, water quality testing were also carried out using the colour comparator-based water quality testing kits for having the first-hand information on water quality in their schools and households. The whole of campaign covered more than one lakh students on an average throughout Kerala state.

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The success and impact of Jalam Jeevitham phase -1 have led to the launch of Jalam Jeevitham Phase 2 – with a campaign bottom line as '**Campus to Community**' – in the **343 selected strategic locations within the 93 Urban Local Bodies**, with the support of the NSS student volunteers.

Overview of the campaign

The Jalam Jeevitham phase 2 campaign was carried out in the year 2024. The campaign aimed to tackle the growing issues related to water by empowering students and communities with knowledge and resources through trained NSS student volunteers. Through collaboration between AMRUT Mission, and the Education Department, the campaign created a robust platform for widespread community engagement . The campaign included activities such as Water Parliament among different groups of students community and discussion for up keep of the water resources, Thelineerotam (Freshwater flows), "Jalakhosham", and "Jalashapatham" (pledge on water conservation) and hanging Danglers in several shops and malls. The messages & information on water conservation and sanitation were disseminated to the General public through trained NSS volunteers of various schools. By reaching over 350 schools across Kerala, the campaign engaged young minds in shaping the future of water conservation. These students, trained in advocacy and public awareness techniques, becomes the driving force behind the various campaign activities. The campaign served as a blend of education, community engagement, and practical action.

Objectives

The campaign's overarching objective was to inspire behavior change at the grassroots level by educating individuals about the environmental, economic, and social significance of water. Moreover, the project sought to:

- ◆ *To enhance awareness among the school Children, adolescents and the general public about the importance of water conservation towards water security.*
- ◆ *To promote a sense of collective responsibility towards water resource protection, conservation and Management through community participation for a greater social cause.*

- ◆ *To involve youth in experiential activities that highlight sustainable water recourse management practices inclusive of water quality assessments, judicious usage of water resources etc.*
- ◆ *To build a network of engaged citizens and local bodies actively contributing to water sustainability.*
- ◆ *To promote actionable steps for water preservation, including rainwater harvesting, and reducing wastage of water.*

Stakeholders and Collaborations:

The success of the Jalam Jeevitham campaign was attributed to the strong partnerships formed between various stakeholders. These included:

- AMRUT Mission, which provided the overall coordination, necessary support and funding for the campaign.
- NSS units from over 350 schools, volunteered their time and effort to organize and execute campaign activities.
- Local authorities, including Chairpersons, standing committee chairpersons and ward counsellors, facilitated the campaign at the local level.
- Community groups, such as environmental NGOs and SHGs, helped amplify the campaign's reach.

These collaborations were essential for ensuring that the message of water conservation reached every corner of the community, from urban centers to peri urban areas.



CHAPTER 1: CAMPAIGN ACTIVITIES AND STRATEGIES

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Water Parliamentary Sessions

One of the key features of the Jalam Jeevitham campaign was the Water Parliamentary Sessions. These sessions simulated parliamentary debates, with students acting as policymakers, and discussing critical water management issues.

The students and community representatives gathered for a session where they debated about water conservation measures tailored to local needs. The session provided a platform for dialogue between students and local experts, helping participants understand the implications of water scarcity and possible solutions.

Public Oath-Taking Sessions

The public oath-taking ceremonies were organized at various events to engage community members in a commitment to sustainable water use. The student volunteers and community participants took a pledge to conserve water in their daily utility, emphasizing individual responsibility. Similarly, at GVHSS Cherpulassery, Palakkad, the oath-taking ceremony was accompanied by a rally, with students leading the way in promoting the message of judicious utilization of water and its conservation.



Processions and Rallies:

The processions and rallies were integral part of awareness creation spreading the campaign's message. These activities, organized at various locations, served as public interest and support for water conservation. The large procession made its way through the town, carrying banners and chanting slogans about the importance of saving water.

Other significant rallies took place in urban and peri-urban areas, where student volunteers and local residents joined hands to spread the campaign's message far and wide.



Street Plays

Street plays were conducted in the areas such as bus stands, markets, and public squares. These plays served as a medium to educate the public on the challenges of water conservation and the urgent need for action. The student volunteers performed a play that dramatized the effects of poor water management and its deleterious effects, followed by a broader discussion and knowledge sharing with the audience group.

As part of the campaign's outreach efforts, message danglers were hung in prominent locations, including marketplaces and public spaces. These danglers, featuring catchy slogans and impactful visuals, acted as constant reminders for the public to adopt water resources conservation and practices in their daily routines.



CHAPTER 2: COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND IMPACT

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The “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign, launched by AMRUT Mission, Government of Kerala, was a comprehensive, state-wide initiative focused on raising awareness about water conservation, sustainable water management, and safer sanitation practices. The campaign aimed at students, local communities, and authorities across the Urban areas in Kerala, the campaign sought to foster a deep sense of responsibility towards the conservation and effective management of water resources. This chapter delves into the community engagement strategies employed during the campaign and evaluates the substantial impact these efforts had on the participants and the broader community.

Strategic Community Engagement: “A Multidimensional Approach”

The “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign employed a comprehensive strategy to engage a wide array of stakeholders, with key partnerships between the NSS Units and the Local Self-Governments. Tailoring its activities to suit the distinct needs of both urban and peri-urban areas in Kerala, the campaign embraced the state's geographical and cultural diversity. Central to its approach was the goal of fostering widespread involvement, particularly through educational institutions. By focusing on students, teachers, and local residents, the campaign reached diverse Socio-Economic groups and empowered younger generations to take active roles in promoting water conservation related activities within their families and communities.

Reaching Diverse Audiences: “Urban and Peri-urban Communities are alike”

In Kerala, where urban and peri-urban areas have distinct challenges, the “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign tailored its approach to the local needs. In Idukki, the focus was on rainwater harvesting in tanks and ponds and irrigation capability improvements, while Ernakulam addressed domestic water use, wastewater treatment and reuse, and water-efficient technologies inclusive of water circularity are discussed. This regional strategy made the campaign’s message relevant to communities of the location specific terrains.

Schools played a central role, engaging students as ambassadors for water conservation. Events like street plays, rallies, oath-taking ceremonies, and water parliamentary sessions fostered participation from local communities and officials, spreading water conservation practices beyond the classroom.

Empowering Students: “The Catalysts for Change”

A hallmark of the “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign was the active role played by students in organizing, implementing, and driving key activities. Students were not just passive participants but were empowered to become advocates for water conservation, leading initiatives that spanned beyond the confines of the school. Through street plays, awareness rallies, and discussions, students directly engaged with the larger community, spreading the message of water conservation and also safer liquid waste management as part of safer sanitation campaign.

At VVHSS Vellimon in Kollam, students led an awareness rally through local streets, taking ownership of the campaign and becoming ambassadors for water conservation.



Peer-to-peer communication played a crucial role in the campaign's success, with students encouraging water-saving practices in their households. Their enthusiasm sparked a cultural shift towards sustainability campaign on water resources across the urban areas in Kerala, inspiring families to adopt water saving and water efficient practices in their daily chores.

The Role of Local Authorities: -“Strengthening Community Collaboration”

The "Jalam Jeevitham" campaign thrived due to the strong collaboration between local authorities, community stakeholders, and educational institutions. Local governments supported the campaign by promoting it through media, providing logistics, and distributing educational materials across districts like Thrissur, Ernakulam, and Kollam. This partnership ensured that the message reached a wide audience and integrated water conservation efforts into ongoing community projects. As a result, students developed a deeper awareness of water management, leading many schools to implement rainwater harvesting systems and water saving and water - efficient technologies. In districts like Idukki, Kollam, and Pathanamthitta, water conservation committees have been established to maintain the judicious utilization of water resources ensuring sustainability.

CHAPTER 3: COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW OF DISTRICT-LEVEL PARTICIPATION

The "Jalam Jeevitham" campaign engaged over 350 schools spread across Kerala, highlighting the region's diverse cultural, geographical, and socio-economic contributions in terms of water saving and conservation related initiatives. The initiative leveraged Kerala's regional diversity, tailoring its approach to meet local needs, from Alappuzha's coastal plains to Idukki's hilly terrain

Thiruvananthapuram

In Thiruvananthapuram, the capital, schools like GVHSS Vattiyoorakavu led rallies and educational programs, amplifying the campaign's visibility.

CHAPTER 4: SUCCESS THROUGH COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIP

The “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign, led by the AMRUT Mission, LSGD, Government of Kerala, demonstrates how collaboration can drive large-scale environmental impact, highlighting key partnerships that contributed to its success and Kerala’s water conservation efforts.

Role of AMRUT Mission

The AMRUT Mission provides coordination works and technical expertise on urban water management, used water management in the 93 urban local bodies. This partnership bridged education with practical solutions, extending the campaign's reach and impact.

Role of the National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS units were the backbone of the "Jalam Jeevitham" campaign, mobilizing volunteers, coordinating logistics, and providing training to students and faculty. With its reach across Kerala's educational network, NSS connected urban organizing activities like water parliamentary sessions, street plays, and rallies, embedding water conservation education in over 343 locations in urban areas.

Contribution of the Local Self-Governments

The Local Self-Governments ensured community participation and sustainability by integrating water conservation into governance, mobilizing resources for events, and continuing to implement water and waste water management, ensuring the campaign's long-term impact.

Role of Educational Institutions:

Educational institutions were at the heart of the “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign. The success of the “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign was fuelled by the active role of educational institutions, with schools engaging students through impactful events on water conservation. Partnering with the NSS, the initiative scaled across Kerala, addressing local water issues and fostering student responsibility. AMRUT Mission, Local Self-Governments, and Schools established a sustainable framework for integrating water conservation into governance and education, laying the groundwork for innovative solutions and long-term impact, and offering a replicable model for large-scale environmental initiatives.

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CHAPTER 5: FEEDBACK AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The “Jalam Jeevitham” campaign was a collaborative initiative promoting water conservation across the urban areas of Kerala. Engaging students, educators, local authorities, and the community, the campaign successfully raised awareness about sustainable water practices. Gathering feedback from diverse stakeholders provided critical insights into its effectiveness and areas for improvement, offering actionable recommendations for future initiatives.



Insights from Stakeholder Feedback

Students and Youth Engagement:

Students, the backbone of the campaign, appreciated its interactive activities like street plays and water parliament sessions. These events deepened their understanding of water management challenges. However, they expressed a desire for hands-on experiences, such as installing water conservation systems and participating in water quality survey and monitoring, to complement theoretical discussions.

Educators' Observations:

Teachers observed that there has been an increased student engagement with environmental issues and its critical understanding during the campaign mode. They recommended aligning educational materials with the formal curriculum and incorporating multidisciplinary approaches to water conservation. Additionally, educators suggested professional development workshops to better equip them for managing various attributes of environmental projects.

Local Authorities and Governance:

Collaboration with local governments ensured a widespread participation of many stakeholders reinforcing the message of collective responsibility for water management. Authorities emphasized the need for sustained community mobilization and empowerment programs to maintain long-term conservation efforts.

Public Response and Volunteer Contributions:

Volunteers played a crucial role in organizing rallies and spreading awareness. While many found the experience fulfilling, some highlighted the need for apt leadership and communication towards water and sanitation campaign sectors so as to improve coordination and better event management.

Recommendations for Future Campaigns

1. Introducing Practical Projects:

Incorporate hands-on activities like rainwater harvesting and watershed management to provide real-world engagement. This approach can help students and communities take ownership of local water conservation efforts.

2. Enhancing Educational Resources for Teachers:

Develop curriculum-based toolkits with lesson plans, multimedia resources, and cross-disciplinary links. Offer workshops to train educators in integrating water conservation themes effectively.

3. Expanding Outreach to Underserved Areas:

Focus on reaching rural and marginalized regions through mobile awareness units, local radio programs, and culturally relevant materials. Collaborate with community leaders to ensure inclusive participation.

4. Fostering Long-Term Sustainability:

Empower communities with capacity-building programs on water management techniques, such as water quality monitoring and resource allocation. Strengthening local leadership ensures the campaign's impact extends beyond its initial phase.



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CONCLUSION

Summary of Achievements

The Jalam Jeevitham campaign emerged as a remarkable endeavor, uniting more than 343 locations across the 93 Urban Local Bodies of Kerala under the banner of water conservation and sanitation. Through this concerted effort, the campaign effectively disseminated its core message, reaching a wide and diverse audience spanning urban hubs, peri urban areas and coastal regions. By engaging an extensive network of NSS volunteers, educators, and local governing bodies, the initiative fostered a collective sense of responsibility towards safeguarding water resources.

A defining highlight of the campaign was its multifaceted approach to awareness-building, which included interactive water parliamentary sessions, dynamic street plays, and vibrant public rallies. These activities enabled students and community members to actively participate in discussions about sustainable water use, bridging gaps between theory and practical application. The inclusion of culturally resonant methods, such as message processions and creative visuals, further amplified the impact, making the message accessible and memorable.

Long-Term Impact
