

Minutes of the 33rd State Level Technical Committee (SLTC) of AMRUT-1.0 held on 08th October 2025 at 3:30 PM, Chaired by the Principal Secretary, Local Self Government Department

The meeting of the 33rd State Level Technical Committee of AMRUT-1.0, chaired by Smt. Tinku Biswal IAS, Principal Secretary, Local Self Government Department, commenced at 3:30 PM on 08th October 2025 (List of participants attached as Annexure-1). Sri. Agenda Item No.33.4.11: Implementation of Urban Planning Reform under SSASCI 2025-2026 – GIS-based Utility Mapping of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Storm Water Drainage Network in AMRUT Phase-I Cities:

Background:

Under the Urban Planning Reforms of the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SSASCI) 2024-2025, GIS-based utility mapping of water supply, sewerage, and storm water drainage networks was one of the identified reforms. As part of the reform implementation, the State had submitted GIS shapefiles of utilities mapped in 9 AMRUT cities — water supply networks in the nine AMRUT cities, sewerage networks in Thiruvananthapuram and Kochi, and storm water drainage networks in Thiruvananthapuram, Guruvayur, Palakkad, and Kozhikode. Based on the submission and compliance with reform requirements, the State has received an incentive amounting to ₹5.50 Cr. under SSASCI 2024-2025.

In continuation of the scheme, under Part X – Urban Planning Reforms of the SSASCI 2025-2026, GIS-based utility mapping of water supply, sewerage, and storm water drainage networks on the GIS portal and the PM Gati Shakti portal has again been identified as one of the key reforms. The objective of this reform is to enhance resource management, mitigate environmental impacts, and enable data-driven decision making for efficient urban infrastructure planning.

As per the eligibility criteria prescribed by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), the State must map/digitize the existing water supply network, storm water drainage, and sewerage network layers on the final GIS base layers created under the AMRUT GIS Sub-Scheme or any other Government scheme/initiative. All networks should be created on a GIS platform and publish all the GIS utility maps on PM Gati Shakti Portal. The GIS structure and content should adhere to the design and standards published by MoHUA.

The eligible incentive for this reform is ₹3 Cr. per city, to be released on a pro-rata basis (₹5.50 Cr. will be deducted). The available utilities in the cities are as follows:

Proposal:

In line with the implementation of the reform, the utility mapping of Water supply, Sewerage and storm water drainage has to be done for 9 phase 1 AMRUT cities through empaneled accredited agencies of the State, who have prior experience in utility mapping.

The key deliverables and outcomes envisaged in the proposal are as follows:

- City-wise geospatial database of 9 cities.
- GIS layers (shapefiles, Geo TIFFs) for water bodies, drainage, and KWA assets.
- Condition assessment reports and asset metadata in standardized formats.
- Interactive Web GIS Dashboard for planning, monitoring, and decision-making.
- Training and handover to KWA and ULB officials for sustainable operation and maintenance.
- Establishment of a future-ready, data-driven asset management system aligned with AMRUT 2.0 and Smart City Mission objectives.

The estimated cost for the GIS-based utility mapping activity is **₹10,93,74,082.70**.

Source of Funds:

AMRUT Phase-I projects are scheduled for completion by December 2025, and balance funds are expected to remain available under the Mission. It is proposed that the cost for the GIS-based utility mapping be met from the balance funds of AMRUT Phase-I.

Decision:

The Committee decided to recommend the following to the SHPSC:

- ❖ Designating the State Mission Management Unit (SMMU) of AMRUT to undertake the GIS-based utility mapping of assets in the nine Phase-I AMRUT cities through accredited empanelled agencies who have prior experience in the utility mapping of water supply, sewerage and storm water drainage systems in Kerala.
- ❖ Earmarking an amount of ₹10,93,74,082.70 from the balance funds available under AMRUT Phase-I towards meeting the estimated cost of the GIS-based utility mapping.
- ❖ The Kerala Water Authority and the nine Phase-I AMRUT cities shall provide all available data and necessary assistance to the selected agency as and when required for the successful completion of the work.
- ❖ The selected agency shall complete the GIS-based utility mapping of water supply, sewerage, and storm water drainage networks in the nine Phase-I AMRUT cities and to submit the shapefiles before 15th December 2025 for claiming incentives under SSACI 2025-2026.
- ❖ The vetting of the proposal shall be done by a committee comprising, Mission Director, AMRUT, Managing Director, KWA, Chief Engineer, LSGD and Chief Town Planner (Planning), LSGD.
