Agenda Item No.10.3: PROGRESS OF AMRUT 2.0:	<p><i>The committee took note of the recommendations of the SLTC and decided as follows:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ The Committee directed KWA and ULBs to expedite the process and ensure that all works commence at the site before the end of March 2025. ❖ The Committee instructed ULBs and KWA to prominently display AMRUT Citizen Information Boards at all ongoing project sites. ❖ The Chair directed KWA to ensure that provisions for road restoration are incorporated while preparing estimates. Failure to address this could lead to significant public protests. ❖ The Committee noted with concern towards the delay in the commencement of Micro Water Supply projects at site. The Committee directed the Chief Engineer LSGD to assess the delays and implement corrective measures. Additionally, the Committee emphasized the importance of sustainable water sources by source strengthening measures and maintaining water quality standards. The Chair instructed the AMRUT and the ULBs to incorporate the necessary provisions to ensure long-term water security. ❖ The Committee noted that the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has entrusted the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) as the Independent Review and Monitoring Agency (IRMA) to oversee AMRUT 2.0 projects in Kerala. ❖ The Committee acknowledged that, under the AMRUT 2.0 IEC initiative, four Mobile Septage Treatment Units (MTUs) have been deployed at Sabarimala, ensuring efficient and sustainable septage waste treatment. ❖ With respect to the pending Government Orders (GOs) with the Finance Department pertaining to the execution of an indemnity bond instead of a bank guarantee for cases where KWA undertakes road restoration directly, and another to permit road cutting during the Defect Liability Period, the Committee instructed the Secretary of PWD to expedite the issuance of these orders. ❖ Committee acknowledged that the delay in issuing the GO allowing an indemnity bond instead of a bank guarantee, significantly impact approximately 20 water supply/ SEW projects under AMRUT 1.0 and AMRUT 2.0. <p>Agenda Item No.10.4: Administrative Sanction for Sewerage & Septage Sector Projects Under SWAP-3:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Considering the importance of implementing sewerage & septage sector projects in the State, as well as the recommendations of the SLTC and the justifications given by KWA, the committee decided to accord Administrative Sanction for the above-mentioned 25 projects (Thiruvananthapuram Corporation-18, Kollam Corporation-3, Alappuzha Municipality-1, Kochi Corporation-2 & Kannur Corporation-1) worth ₹367.709 Cr. (Capex: ₹327.801 Cr. & O&M: ₹39.907 Cr.) subject to the following conditions. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any amount included in the DPR prepared by KWA as DPR Charges/ Supervision Charges shall be utilized for works, as the same cannot be accepted since the assets created through the projects are coming under KWA, and since the sewerage works are mandated works of KWA. • The amount set aside by KWA in the DPR of the project of Thiruvananthapuram Corporation (related to the STP at Muttathara) for the supply and installation of AC units shall be utilized for works, as the same can't be considered, and the amount set aside in the DPR of the same project for the supply and installation of CCTV camera unit is approved as the same is required for security purposes. • In the case of the projects where the Capex Cost as per the DPR exceeds the Capex Cost as per SWAP, the excess amount required shall be borne by the concerned ULB. ❖ In the case of the project (STP at Kottappuram) of Thrissur Corporation where there is public protest, the ULB shall resolve the public protest or identify alternative land or submit a replacement sewage/septage management project by 31.03.2025; otherwise, the SWAP amount set aside for the project will be reallocated for the approved projects in the buffer list. ❖ In the case of the project (STP at Kokkala) of Thrissur Corporation, where the clearance for the proposed land for the STP has been rejected by the Agriculture Dept., the committee directed as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The ULB shall submit the technical details of the STP to the District Collector for preparing a report on the matter, as decided in the meeting held in this regard on 17.02.2025. • The Govt. will take an appropriate decision on allowing the ULB to construct the STP at the proposed land at Kokkala (Koorkkanchery) based on the District Collector's report. • Decision on according administrative sanction for the project will be taken by the committee based on the decision taken by the Govt. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ The Govt. 11.3.6. INDEPENDENT REVIEW AND MONITORING AGENCY (IRMA):

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has designated the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) as the Third-Party Independent Review and Monitoring Agency (IRMA) for AMRUT 2.0 projects.

IRMA has completed the first round of site visits to review AMRUT 2.0 projects in Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, and Ernakulam districts, covering a total of 208 projects (Thiruvananthapuram – 11, Kollam – 105, and Kochi – 92). The observations, comments, and suggestions from these visits have been uploaded by IRMA on the AMRUT 2.0 Collaboration Portal. Based on these observations, the State has uploaded the corresponding action taken/compliance reports in the portal.

After the completion of the first-round visits, NIUA signed an MoU with NIT Calicut to carry out the functions of IRMA on its behalf. The second round of evaluations by NIT Calicut is presently ongoing in Kozhikode.

11.3.7. CAPACITY BUILDING:

- A Training-cum-Exposure Visit to Ahmedabad on *Urban Planning, Blue-Green Infrastructure, and Institutionalization* has been arranged for the officials of LSGD (Planning).
- An Orientation Training-cum-Workshop on the *Formulation of GIS-based Master Plans for 49 Cities* has been organized for the Secretaries and Engineers of the respective cities.
- An Exposure Visit has been arranged to Coimbatore for the officials and elected representatives of Guruvayoor Municipality to understand *Interception-Diversion Projects*. Guruvayoor has planned a Sewerage Project (Interception-Diversion) for Valiyathode, focusing on effective *wastewater management and treatment*.

Agenda Item No.11.4: Water Supply Sector: SWAP 3 - Administrative Sanction for the Projects of Nilambur & Parappanangadi Municipalities:

Under the 3rd Tranche of the State Water Action Plan, 71 Water supply projects were approved in the 11th APEX committee of MoHUA held on 23.09.2024. Administrative sanctions have been issued for 61 proposals, excluding eight numbers, 24X7 WS proposals, and two proposals from the Parappanangadi and Nilambur Municipalities, for which NOCs were pending for land.

For Nilambur Municipality, the Secretary, Nilambur Municipality, vide letter No. 1486535-2025 dated 9.5.2025 (**Annexure 3A**), has requested the issuance of administrative sanction for the project, considering the in-principle approval from the Ministry of Environment, Forests, and Climate Change.

A permissive sanction from the Forest Department had to be obtained for the construction of 9LL OHSR at Banglavukunnu. Now the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change has granted the in-principle approval for diversion of 0.0918 ha of forest land for the construction of an overhead service reservoir at Nilambur, Kerala, in favor of M/s Municipal Secretary Nilambur, subject to fulfillment of various general conditions and specific conditions such as Compensatory Afforestation. After receipt of the compliance report on fulfilment of the conditions, the proposal will be considered for final approval. Transfer of forest land shall not be affected till final approval is granted by the Central Government in this regard.

For Parappanangadi Municipality, vide Government Order of the Revenue Department, GO (Rt) No. 279/2025/RD dated 22.09.2025 (**Annexure 3B**), sanction has been accorded to transfer 15 cents of revenue land at Chappapady Fisheries Hospital to KWA on lease for 30 years (at the rate of Rs. 100 per Are) for the construction of a 15 LL OHSR under AMRUT 2.0.

AUGMENTATION OF UWSS TO NILAMBUR PHASE 1" for an amount of **Rs. 11.47 Cr. (CAPEX- Rs. 9.57 Cr. & O&M- Rs. 1.9 Cr.)** on the condition that works shall be taken up only after obtaining final approval from the MoEF.

- ❖ **Administrative Sanction for the water supply project in Parappanangadi Municipality- AMRUT 2.0** - Construction of 15.00LL OHSR at Chappappadi, Clear Water Pumping Main and Functional Household Connections for an amount of **₹15.50 Cr. (CAPEX- ₹15.00 Cr. & O&M- ₹0.50 Cr.)**
- ❖ The Committee instructed the Managing Director, KWA, to take immediate action to initiate further procedures for issuing the Technical Sanction and for tendering without further delay.
- ❖ The Central Assistance for urban development projects should not cover the costs of Operation & Maintenance, Supervision charges, or the Value of land/ structures required for the project development. These costs should be borne by the state, ULB, or KWA.

Decision to be Taken:

- ❖ *The committee may review the recommendations of the SLTC and take a suitable decision on the issuance of administrative sanctions for the above-mentioned projects.*

Agenda Item No.11.5: Water Supply Sector – Revision of Administrative Sanction of Projects:

Twelve (12) proposals from Nine (9) Urban Local Bodies have been received for revising the Administrative Sanction of Water Supply projects due to tender excess/ estimate revision/ PRICE revision.

As per the SHPSC decision, for 9 AMRUT 1.0 cities, 75% of the amount due to tender excess may be met by the ULB, and the remaining 25% may be met by the State. For AMRUT 2.0 cities, 50% of the amount due to tender excess may be met by the ULB, and the remaining 50 % will be met by the State. The details of the projects are as follows:

(A) AS REVISION DUE TO DESIGN CHANGE AND INCREASE IN ROAD RESTORATION COSTS:

The revision to the Administrative Sanction (AS) for the Water Supply projects in **Mannarkad** is due to a design change and increase in road restoration costs.

Further, the Tender Appraisal Committee, in its meeting held on 29th September 2025 ([Annexure-4](#)), recommended approval of the AS revision for the water supply projects, with the observation that, since the source of funding to meet the excess amount has not been identified, the matter may be placed before the SLTC for an appropriate decision.

Agenda Item No.11.12: Micro Water Supply Scheme: Administrative Sanction of Micro Water Supply projects in Kanhagad & Valancherry Municipalities:

1) SWAP-1 - Vazhunnoradi Micro drinking water supply Scheme/Project of Kanhagad Municipality:

As per the letter no. E1/13803/21, dated 26.05.2025 ([Annexure-11](#)), the Secretary, Kanhagad Municipality, requested to issue the Administrative Sanction for Micro water supply projects. The Council resolution No.5 dated 10.6.2022 and the detailed project report of the project are attached as [Annexure 11](#).

The Micro Water Supply scheme of Vazhunnoradi Micro drinking water supply system is basically a complete renovation of the existing system to provide a safe and potable Drinking water supply system. The selected wards are where the KWA could not provide a potable drinking water supply. The initiative aims to ensure year-round availability of clean potable drinking water through sustainable measures, benefiting community members in 22, 23, and 24 wards. This proposed Micro water supply project in Vazhunnoradi has a source of an existing open well of 6.00 m diameter and 9 metres Depth located at “Arayi Karthika close by to a perennial river source”.

The Total number of household connections proposed in the phase-1 implementation of the above project is 900 households at the rate of 135 LPCD. The total cost of the project proposed in the first phase is five crores (Capex ₹5.00 cr., Opex: ₹0.15 cr.).

The per FHTC/ Unit cost is: Rs 55,556.00. As the project area is mostly a saline water intruded area with few exceptional open wells in dune-like geomorphology close by to the river course regions, it provides a moderately good quality water amidst saline zones.

2) SWAP-3 - Kalayana Urava Water Supply Scheme of Valancherry Municipality:

The Micro water supply scheme of Valancherry comprises the Kalayana Urava Water Supply Scheme with a check dam, and seven micro-projects were approved under SWAP-3 for ₹13.274 Cr. The proposed project addresses water scarcity in Valancherry Municipality, particularly in higher elevation areas where the KWA could not provide a potable drinking water supply. The initiative aims to ensure year-round availability of clean potable drinking water through sustainable measures, benefiting 13 wards.

Under the Kalayana Urava Water Supply Scheme, 5 projects worth ₹4.92 Cr. were approved by the 10th SHPSC meeting. Now, the Municipal Council vide resolution No.03 dated 08.07.2025 has decided to approve the 2 micro-projects targeting specific areas: ([Annexure-11](#))

- Kakkattupara Thaniyappan Kunnu: Aimed at 1275 households.
- Kakkattupara Kanjippura: Targeting 950 households.

Agenda Item No.11:13: Micro Water supply scheme: Kothamangalam Municipality (Ward: 27) – Vilayil Micro water Schemes- AS Revision due to tender excess:

The proposal for revision to the Administrative Sanction (AS) for the **Vilayil MWSS** Micro water supply project has been received from the Kothamangalam Municipality due to tender excess. The excess amount has been accepted by the respective ULBs in accordance with the prevailing Government Order [G.O.(P) No. 54/2019/Fin dated 04.05.2019] from the Finance Department, which stipulates that the maximum admissible contract PAC should be limited to the lower of the LMR or the prevailing DSR + 10% excess. The technical committee held by the CE/ LSGD on 5.6.2025 had also reviewed the same and decided to approve the tender excess (**Annexure-12**)

As per the SHPSC decision, for 9 AMRUT 1.0 cities, 75% of the amount due to tender excess may be met by the ULB, and the balance 25% may be met by the State. **For AMRUT 2.0 cities, 50% of the amount due to tender excess may be met by the ULB, and the balance 50 % to be met by the State.**

The revised Unit cost comes to around ₹ 63,447.05 / household. The slightly higher cost is justified as the proposed settlements in Ward 27 are basically undulating terrains, and moreover KWA water supply system has not reached the deprived community in the provision of safe and potable drinking water. Hence, the ULB has to take the initiative in provisioning safe and potable drinking water to the households in Ward 27.

Agenda Item No.11.14: SEW Sector - SWAP 3 - Administrative Sanction for Sewerage & Septage Sector Projects:

Under AMRUT-2.0, projects worth ₹457.81 Cr. (Capex) were approved under SWAP-1 (₹69.56 Cr. - Thiruvananthapuram Corporation) and SWAP-2 (Capex: ₹388.24 Cr. – Kollam, Kochi, and Kozhikode Corporations). Administrative Sanctions have been issued for the SWAP-1 and SWAP-2 projects, and these projects are under various stages of implementation. Approvals for 31 SWAP-3 projects worth ₹592.15 Cr. (Capex) were received from the MoHUA on 01.10.2024. Out of this, administrative sanctions for 25 projects (Thiruvananthapuram Corporation – 18 nos..., Kollam Corporation – 3 nos., Alappuzha Municipality – 1 no., Kochi Corporation – 2 nos. & Kannur Corporation – 1 no.) worth ₹327.801 Cr. (Capex) were approved by the 10th SHPSC, and administrative sanctions are to be issued for the balance 6 projects (Alappuzha Municipality – 1 no., Thrissur Corporation – 2 nos., Guruvayur Municipality – 1 no., Palakkad Municipality – 1 no. & Kozhikode Corporation – 1 no.).

The projects of Kozhikode Corporation and Thrissur Corporation were placed in the 14th SLTC for approval of administrative sanctions. The committee directed the Thrissur Corporation to submit a basic

report on the combined Kokkala and Kottappuram sewerage project (inclusive of septage co-treatment) for taking an appropriate decision regarding the issuance of administrative sanction. Hence, only the proposal from Kozhikode is placed in this SHPSC.

Kozhikode Corporation:

As per the letter no. EG3/188363/2025 dated 10.06.2025 & letter no. EG3/188363/2025 dated 28.06.2025, the Secretary, Kozhikode Corporation ([Annexure-13](#)), has submitted the DPR of the sewerage project and has informed the following:

- ❖ The Avikkalthodu (7 MLD) and Kothi (6 MLD) projects (2 STPs & associated sewer networks) of Kozhikode Corporation could not be implemented under AMRUT-1.0 due to public protest and court cases.
- ❖ These projects were shifted to AMRUT-2.0 after getting the approval of the SHPSC (Decision No.32-AA.3 & G.O. Rt No. 523/2023/LSGD dated 02.03.2023).
- ❖ Since the proposed site of the Avikkalthodu STP had a stay by the court, the ULB decided to avoid the location and to merge the Avikkalthodu and Kothi projects with a common STP in a different location.
- ❖ As suggested by the District Collector, the ULB decided to propose the STP for the combined project in the West Hill Industrial Estate, where the ULB has 97 Cents of land.
- ❖ The ULB decided to implement the new STP in the DBOT mode and the work was subsequently awarded to the JV between M/s. Koya and Company Construction Ltd. (KCCL) and M/s. Ayyappa Infra Projects Pvt. Ltd. (AIPPL).
- ❖ The agreement was executed on 21.05.2025 for ₹64.309 Cr., and the DPR prepared by the contractor is submitted in this SHPSC for approval for issuance of AS.
- ❖ For the Avikkalthodu and Kothi sewer network projects, the ULB had an agreement with the contractor, M/s. Nasit Infra Projects Private Limited, Ahmedabad, for ₹102.070 Cr.
- ❖ The contractor had approached the Hon'ble High Court for the start of the work, and for the release of the payment related to the supply of sewer pipes, which were stopped because the STP works were not being started at the site.
- ❖ The Hon'ble High Court had initially decided to give six weeks to the ULB to inform them of their final decision on resolving the issue.
- ❖ Since the AS of the project has not been issued under AMRUT-2.0, the ULB requested the Hon'ble High Court to give a timeframe of six months.
- ❖ Recently, the Hon'ble High Court decided to give three months to the ULB to resolve the issue.
- ❖ The ULB discussed the issue with the contractor and the contractor expressed their willingness to continue the sewer network work.
- ❖ As per the above-mentioned letter dated 26.08.2025, the ULB has requested to increase the Capex amount to ₹166.660 as they require nearly ₹0.29 Cr. more for making payments related to KSPCB & CRZ clearances.
- ❖ The ULB requires a total amount of ₹166.660 Cr. (Capex) for the STP and sewer network projects (including the amount required for obtaining CRZ clearance), which is ₹33.500 Cr. more than the SWAP amount allotted (₹133.160 Cr.) to the ULB under the Sewerage & Septage Sector.
- ❖ The ULB proposes to meet the additional Capex fund requirement (₹33.500 Cr.) from the savings (₹33.500 Cr.) in the work, '*Augmentation of 174 MLD to 210 MLD of Peruvannamoozhi Plant - Replacing of Premo and AC pipe transmission main at Malaparamba and Tali, and providing balance FHTC's in Kozhikode Corporation*' (AS Capex: ₹110.000 Cr.), under the Water Supply Sector of the ULB.

- ❖ The Council held on 28.05.2025 (Resolution No. 195/1) gave consent to utilize the savings in the water supply project.

Justification for more than ₹1 Lakh Cost Per Beneficiary:

- The project covers the Corporation Office, Govt. Beach Hospital, Govt. Hospitality Management College, Akashavani Kozhikode, Govt offices (Police Station, Industrial Estate etc.), Vellayil Harbour and Kozhikode Beach, and commercial establishments (50 Nos.).
- Considering the number of people visiting these facilities, the total number of beneficiaries will be around 18000.

14th SLTC Recommendation:

The committee decided to recommend the following to the SHPSC:

- ❖ **Approval of administrative sanction for the SEW Sector project of Kozhikode Corporation, 'Sewerage System for Zone A' (STP at West Hill and Sewer Network - AS Amount: ₹180.66 Cr., Capex: ₹166.66 Cr. and O&M: ₹14.00 Cr.),** subject to the condition that the additional amount required (₹33.500 Cr. more than the approved SWAP amount) shall be met from the savings available in the WS Sector work, 'Augmentation of 174 MLD to 210 MLD of Peruvannamoozhi Plant - Replacing of Premo and AC pipe transmission main at Malaparamba and Tali, and providing balance FHTCs in Kozhikode Corporation'.
- ❖ The committee directed the Thrissur Corporation to submit a basic report on the combined Kokkala and Kottappuram sewerage project (inclusive of septage co-treatment) for taking an appropriate decision regarding the issuance of administrative sanction.
- ❖ The committee directed the Thrissur Corporation to execute the SEW sector work, '100 KLD Septage Treatment Plant', under AMRUT-2.0, within the funds available for the combined Kokkala and Kottappuram sewerage project, **subject to the condition that the land for the septage treatment plant shall be confirmed by the ULB within a week.**
- ❖ The Capex and O&M Cost for the septage treatment plant shall also be reported by the ULB in the basic report to be submitted for the combined Kokkala and Kottappuram sewerage project.

Decision to be Taken:

- ❖ *The committee may review the recommendations of the SLTC and take a suitable decision in approving the administrative sanction for the SEW project of Kozhikode Corporation.*

Agenda Item No.11.15: SEW Sector - Kozhikode Corporation – Change in the Implementing Agency:

As per the letter no. EG3/188363/2025 dated 22.09.2025, the Secretary, Kozhikode Corporation ([Annexure-14](#)) has requested approval for execution of a sewerage project in the DBOT mode by the ULB. The details are as follows:

- ❖ The committee directed the ULB's Secretary to check the possibility of using any other funds available to the ULB for meeting the tender excess.

- ❖ The committee decided to recommend to the SHPSC the change in the implementation agency of the SEW sector project, ‘Sewerage system for Kannur Corporation Zone-1 (5 MLD STP at Maithanapalli/ Marakkarkandy with associated network and septage co-treatment) from KWA to Kannur Corporation.
- ❖ The committee noted that there may be flaws in the process followed by the ULB in the selection of the bid received in the DBOT tender, and directed the ULB to forward all the tender-related documents to the CE, LSGD, for scrutiny and approval of the DBOT tender.

Decision to be Taken:

- ❖ *The committee may review the recommendations of the SLTC and take suitable decisions.*

Agenda Item No.11.17: SEW Sector - Kollam Corporation – Cancellation of Works & Taking Up of Alternative Works:

As per the letter dated 03.10.2025 ([Annexure-16](#)), the Hon’ble Mayor, Kollam Corporation, requested to place the agenda for the approval of the cancellation of 2 sewerage works and for the taking up of an alternative work within the current administrative sanction. The details are as follows:

- ❖ The DSR-2021 came into force with effect from 01.04.2025 as per the Govt. Order dated 26.02.2025 [G.O.(P) No. 21/2025/FIN].
- ❖ Hence, the estimates of the Iron Bridge, Vaadi-Karumalil and Asramom sewer network packages of the Kureepuzha STP were recalculated by KWA as per the DSR-2021, and as per the revised estimates an additional amount of ₹ 10.060 Cr. is required as shown below.

- ❖ Since funds are neither available with the ULB nor AMRUT-2.0 to meet the additional fund requirement, the ULB's council held on 25.09.2025 (Resolution No.64) decided as follows:
 - Cancel the Asramom and Vaadi-Karumalil sewer network packages.
 - Take up the laying of sewer network in Kureepuzha West, Vallikeezhu and adjoining divisions using vacuum technology as an alternative.
 - Implement the sewer network laying using vacuum technology in Kureepuzha West, Vallikeezhu and adjoining divisions, and implement the Iron Bridge sewer network package (conventional method) with the revised estimate under AMRUT-2.0 within the current administrative sanction amount.
- ❖ Dr. Pranab Kumar Mohapatra, Professor and Head, Civil Engineering Dept., IIT Gandhinagar, has prepared a technical evaluation report for the ULB, comparing the vacuum technology and the gravity method of sewer pipe laying.
- ❖ As per the technical evaluation report, the main advantages of the vacuum technology are that the sewer pipes can be laid at shallow depths, smaller diameter pipes can be used, and the velocity can be maintained.
- ❖ As per the letter dated 26.09.2025, the Hon'ble Mayor, Kollam Corporation, has requested the Managing Director, KWA, to take up the sewer network laying in the Kureepuzha West and Vallikeezhu areas using the vacuum technology in the DBOT mode so that the sewer network can be implemented at a faster pace.

14th SLTC Recommendation:

The committee decided to recommend the following to the SHPSC:

- ❖ The committee directed to drop the Pallithottam-Thamarakkulam (AS Amount: ₹45.436 Cr., Capex: ₹39.043 Cr., O&M: ₹6.393 Cr.), Vaadi-Karumalil (AS Amount: ₹30.00 Cr., Capex: ₹24.756 Cr., O&M: ₹5.244 Cr.), and Asramom (₹37.38 Cr., Capex: ₹32.318 Cr., O&M: ₹5.062 Cr.) sewer network packages from AMRUT-2.0 due to the following reasons:
 - In these sewer network packages, the work has to be executed as a continuation of the sewer pipelines laid many years ago, and according to the KWA, the contractors are reluctant to take up such works.
 - Conditional assessment of the existing sewer pipelines needs to be done before starting the works, and the KWA informed that this is taking a lot of time to complete in the case of the already awarded Pallithottam-Thamarakkulam sewer network package.
 - Much more time will be required for commissioning the STP by completing these sewer network packages compared to laying sewer networks in an area where there are no existing sewer pipelines and commissioning the STP.
 - The KWA informed that they faced a lot of difficulty during the commissioning of the Chakkamkandam STP using the sewer network laid many years ago in the Guruvayur Municipality, and issues are still persisting.
 - It may not be possible to complete all 4 sewer network packages before the mission period of AMRUT-2.0 ends (Dec-2026).
- ❖ Considering the above-mentioned reasons, the committee directed KWA to obtain a decision from the Govt regarding abandoning of the existing sewer networks in the above-mentioned 3 sewer network packages.
- ❖ If permission is not obtained from the Govt. for abandoning the existing sewer lines in the Pallithottam-Thamarakkulam, Vaadi-Karumalil, Asramom and sewer network packages, the ULB and KWA may take up the implementation of the same under any other appropriate source of funds.
- ❖ The committee directed the ULB to take up the implementation of the sewer network using vacuum technology in the Kureepuzha West, Vallikeezhu, and adjoining divisions, and the 50 KLD FSTP (from AMRUT-1.0) under AMRUT-2.0 as an alternative for the dropped sewer network packages along with the already taken up Iron Bridge sewer network package.
- ❖ The committee has directed to submit the following so that a decision on the issuance of administrative sanctions can be taken:
 - The KWA shall submit the revised estimate (as per DSR-2021) of the 50 KLD FSTP, mentioning the required Capex and O&M costs.
 - The KWA shall submit the revised estimate (as per DSR-2021) of the Iron Bridge sewer network package, mentioning the required Capex and O&M costs.
 - The DPR and estimate (showing Capex and O&M costs) of the sewer network using vacuum technology shall be submitted by the ULB for utilizing the balance amount available after considering the 50 KLD FSTP and the Iron Bridge sewer network package.

Decision to be Taken:

- ❖ *The committee may review the recommendations of the SLTC and take suitable decisions.*

As per the advisory issued by the MoHUA, the eligible activities for incentive utilization are as follows:

- ❖ **Energy efficiency measures, new and renewable energy for UWTP operations:** Deployment of energy efficiency measures (with documentary evidence indicating energy efficiency gains), installation of solar panels, biogas plants, and other renewable energy solutions to reduce operational costs and carbon footprint.
- ❖ **Biosolids Management:** Enhancing biosolid treatment processes to produce safe, usable by-products for agriculture and landscaping.
- ❖ **Real-Time Data Management Systems:** Implementation of Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems, Online Continuous Emission Monitoring Systems (OCEMS), and other digital solutions to monitor and improve UWTP performance in real-time.
- ❖ **Capacity Building of Staff:** Training programs for operators and field officials to enhance their knowledge and skills in operating and maintaining UWTPs efficiently.
- ❖ **Technology Upgradation:** Adopting advanced treatment technologies to improve treated effluent quality and ensure compliance with environmental standards.
- ❖ **Capital Expenditures for Reuse Infrastructure:** Developing infrastructure to facilitate reusing treated used water, such as pipelines, storage tanks, and distribution systems.
- ❖ **Operating Efficiencies and Improvement of UWTPs:** Deployment of Asset Management Monitoring System/Software, conducting regular maintenance and upgrading essential components of UWTPs to ensure efficient operation and proactive maintenance.

One of the conditions of fund release is the formation of a Water Resource Recovery Cell (WRRC) for the State for ensuring the effective utilization of incentives and the overall success of the Jal Hi Amit initiative. Accordingly, the 10th SHPSC held on 20.02.2025 approved the formation of the WRRC in the State and the related Govt. order has been issued [G.O. (Rt) No. 770/2025/LSGD dated 22.03.2025]. The members of the WRRC are as follows:

- ❖ Principal Secretary, LSGD - Chairperson
- ❖ Director (Urban), LSGD - Member
- ❖ Managing Director, KWA - Member

- ❖ Chief Engineer, LSGD - Member
- ❖ Representatives of KSPCB, Irrigation Dept., Agriculture Dept., Ground Water Dept., Industries Dept. & KSEB - Member
- ❖ Secretary of Relevant LSGIs - Member

As per the advisory issued by the MoHUA, the key responsibilities of the WRRC include:

- ❖ Reviewing and approving proposals from ULBs/Parastatals for incentive utilization.
- ❖ Monitoring the performance of incentivized UWTPs and ensuring compliance with environmental standards.
- ❖ Conducting periodic field visits to assess the quality of treated water and biosolids.
- ❖ Organizing capacity-building programs for UWTP operators and officials in collaboration with technical partners.
- ❖ Promoting awareness and advocacy on reusing treated water and biosolids management.
- ❖ Preparing quarterly reports for submission to the MoHUA.

As per the information received verbally from MoHUA, even though the WRRC has been formed, the proposals for utilizing the incentives under JHA requires the approval of the SLTC/ SHPSC. Hence, the proposals submitted by KWA (4 STPs), Kannur Corporation (1 STP), Thrissur Corporation (1 STP) and Taliparamba Municipality (1 STP) for the utilization of the incentives are placed in this SHPSC for approval. Proposals for utilizing the funds allotted for the balance 8 STPs are to be formulated by the concerned ULBs.

As per the letter no. KWA-JB/4995/2025-AE 10, dated 27.06.2025, the Managing Director, Kerala Water Authority ([Annexure-17](#)), requested approval for the proposals for utilizing the funds allotted under the JHA initiative for 4 STPs. The details are as follows:

Agenda Item No.11.21: Waterbody Rejuvenation Sector: AMRUT 2.0 – Ratification of Tender Excess and Revision of Administrative Sanction Due to Tender Excess and Change from DSR 2018 to DSR 2021.

The tender excess for various AMRUT 2.0 projects has been approved by the respective Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) in accordance with the prevailing Government Order [G.O.(P) No. 54/2019/Fin dated 04.05.2019] issued by the Finance Department. This order mandates that the maximum admissible contract PAC should be limited to the lesser of the Local Market Rate (LMR) or the prevailing Delhi Schedule of Rates (DSR) plus a 10% excess. (Council Decisions Attached as **Annexure 18**)

It is important to note that the Central Government may not fund any portion of the tender excess. As a result, the excess amount may need to be covered jointly by the State and the respective ULBs. During its 8th meeting, the State High Power Steering Committee (SHPSC) decided that, for AMRUT 1.0 cities, 75% of the tender excess amount shall be borne by the ULB and the remaining 25% by the State. For AMRUT 2.0 cities, the tender excess amount shall be shared equally, with 50% borne by the ULB and 50% by the State.

As per the decision of the 13th State Level Technical Committee (SLTC), a Tender Appraisal Committee was constituted. The committee comprises the Chief Engineer, Local Self Government Department (LSGD) (Chairperson and Convenor), the Deputy Chief Engineer in charge of AMRUT projects at the Kerala Water Authority (PIU-2), a representative from the Finance Department, and a representative from SMMU AMRUT.

The aforementioned Tender Appraisal Committee (TAC) is entrusted with reviewing all AMRUT projects involving tender excess and providing recommendations to the SLTC. Accordingly, the **tender excess of the following projects has been duly verified and recommended by the Tender Appraisal Committee (TAC)** in its meeting held on **05.05.2025 & 29.09.2025**. Proposal for Administrative Sanction revision following switch to DSR 2021.

The Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) for various projects under AMRUT 2.0 were initially prepared based on the rates specified in DSR 2018. However, with the implementation of the revised DSR 2021, effective from 05.05.2025, there has been a significant impact on the estimated project costs.

As the original DPRs were framed using the outdated DSR 2018 rates, the adoption of DSR 2021 has resulted in cost escalations across several components of the projects. Consequently, Guruvayoor **Municipality and Ottappalam Municipality (Annexure 18)** have formally requested a revision of the Administrative Sanction to align the approved project costs with the updated DSR 2021 rates. The details are given below.

14th SLTC Recommendation:

❖ The Committee decided to recommend the revision of the Administrative Sanction for the above Nine projects due to tender excess and above five projects in Water Body Rejuvenation due to PRICE revision, considering the recommendations of the Tender Appraisal Committee, subject to the following conditions:

- For AMRUT 1.0 cities, 75% of the tender excess amount shall be borne by the ULB and 25% by the State; for AMRUT 2.0 cities, the tender excess amount shall be shared equally, with 50% borne by the ULB and 50% by the State.
- Any additional cost due to the switch to DSR 2021 may be met through savings from their own waterbody rejuvenation projects or by cancelling their own projects within the same sector. If neither savings nor cancellations are available, the excess cost shall be borne by the respective Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). Descoping options has to be explored, if the ULB is not willing bear the additional cost.
- The ULBs shall submit the Municipal Council's approval.

Agenda Item No.11.22: Formulation of GIS-Based Master Plan - Reconstitution of Consultancy Evaluation & Review Committee (CERC) under AMRUT 2.0 Sub-Scheme.

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Government of India, have launched the sub-scheme of 'Formulation of GIS-based Master Plans for Class II towns under AMRUT 2.0'. 49 cities in Kerala are eligible for getting financial assistance under this Scheme. This is a 100 % Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The State Action Plan (SAP), which is a prerequisite for accessing funds under the Scheme, was submitted to GoI on 16.02.2023 with the approval of SLTC and SHPSC. As per the SAP, the preparation of Master Plans for all 49 cities was proposed to be outsourced. Accordingly, requests for Proposals (RfPs) are to be invited from eligible Consultants through the bidding process.

As outlined in the Scheme Guidelines (Sl.No.10: Review and monitoring mechanism), the works of the Consultants are to be monitored and reviewed by a Consultancy Evaluation and Review Committee (CERC) while in-house works are to be administered by a Monitoring and Review Committee (MRC). The CERC/ MRC will report to the State Level Technical Committee (SLTC). The indicative composition of the CERC as per the Guidelines includes Principal Secretary (UD)/ Director, State Mission Directorate AMRUT as the Chairman.

Works under AMRUT 1.0 sub scheme were carried out in-house and the same was monitored by a Monitoring and Review Committee constituted under the Chairmanship of AMRUT Mission Director. But, as the works under the AMRUT 2.0 sub-scheme is proposed to be outsourced to Consultants, Government, vide G.O.(Rt) No.470/2023/LSGD, Dt: 23.02.2023 (**Annexure-19**), LSGD, has constituted the Consultancy Evaluation and Review Committee (CERC) for monitoring and reviewing the works of Consultants for the Preparation of GIS- Based Master Plan for AMRUT 2.0 Cities with the following members:

The 1st meeting of the Consultancy Evaluation and Review Committee (CERC) under the Chairmanship of Principal Secretary to the Government, LSGD, was convened on 04.04.2025. The work under the sub-scheme, including drone survey, bidding process, etc, is progressing. The progress of the consultancy work under this Scheme is to be reviewed periodically by the Consultancy Evaluation & Review Committee (CERC). As the RFPs are called for based on the Cluster of Towns basis (*a cluster consisting of 4 to 5 towns*), on receipt of the Drone data provided by the Survey of India, frequent meetings of CERC may be required for the selection of consultants, assessing the progress of the consultancy works, etc.

As per the Guidelines for the sub-scheme, the CERC shall report to the SLTC. At present, CERC as well as SLTC are chaired by the Principal Secretary to the Government, LSGD. Hence, to facilitate frequent meetings, ensure smooth functioning, and enable the timely completion of the AMRUT 2.0 sub-scheme, the CERC may be reconstituted with the Mission Director, AMRUT, as its chairman. Agenda Item No.11.23: Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment 2025-26-Part X – Urban Planning Reforms

In continuation of the previous year's Special Assistance schemes, the Government of India has launched the “**Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment 2025-26**” ([Annexure-20](#)). This scheme comprises multiple parts, with **Part X focusing on Urban Planning Reforms**. The objective is to position urban planning as a key driver of development and to promote sustainable urbanization. For the implementation of Part X, States are categorized into three groups:

- Group A & B: Other States (Kerala falls under Group A)
- Group C: North Eastern and Hilly States

Reforms implemented during the following periods will be eligible for incentives:

- **Part A:** Reforms undertaken between 16th January 2025 and 15th December 2025 (Total outlay: ₹13,000 Cr). Part A focuses on reforms related to Governance, Finance, and Urban Land & Planning
- **Part B:** Reforms undertaken between 1st April 2025 and 15th December 2025 (Total outlay: ₹5,000 Cr). Part B covers reforms to promote Ease of Doing Business (EoDB)

States must submit their claims along with supporting documents to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) by 20th December 2025. The roadmap regarding the submission of the reform components is to be submitted within 15–30 days of the scheme's notification.

The incentive amount will be released to States based on recommendations made by MoHUA to the Department of Expenditure (DoE), in accordance with the scheme's guidelines. MoHUA retains the authority to issue clarifications and modify submission timelines in consultation with stakeholders, with the approval of DoE.

Incentive Release

States must submit the list of capital projects to be undertaken using the incentive amount to the Department of Expenditure in the prescribed format.

- ❖ Recommendations for fund release shall be made based on the overall scheme outlay.
- ❖ Funds will be released in a single installment.

Agenda Item No.11.24: Delegation of Powers to Consultancy Evaluation & Review Committee (CERC) for Approval of Selection of Consultant through Outsourcing and Cost Quoted for Formulation of GIS based Master Plans

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Government of India, has launched the sub-scheme of 'Formulation of GIS-based Master Plans for Class II towns under AMRUT 2.0'. 49 cities in Kerala are eligible for getting financial assistance under this Scheme. This is a 100 % Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The State Action Plan (SAP), which is a prerequisite for accessing funds under the Scheme, was submitted to GoI on 16.02.2023 with the approval of SLTC and SHPSC. As per the SAP, the preparation of Master Plans for all 49 cities was proposed to be outsourced. Accordingly, Requests for Proposals (RfPs) are to be invited from eligible Consultants through a bidding process.

As outlined in the Reform Agenda on Formulation of GIS-based Master Plans of Class II Towns (Sl.No.9.2: Funding for formulation of GIS-based Master Plan), if Master Plans are outsourced to a consultant, then the cost quoted by the Consultant and approved by SHPSC/ SLTC will be applicable. The works under AMRUT 2.0 sub-scheme is proposed to be outsourced to Consultants and the Government has constituted the Consultancy Evaluation and Review Committee (CERC) for monitoring and reviewing of the works of Consultants for the Preparation of a GIS Based Master Plan for AMRUT 2.0 Cities.

The work under the sub-scheme, including drone survey, bidding process, etc., is progressing. The progress of the consultancy work under this Scheme is to be reviewed periodically by the Consultancy Evaluation & Review Committee (CERC). As the RFPs are called for based on the Cluster of Towns basis (a cluster consisting of 4 to 5 towns) on receipt of the Drone data provided by the Survey of India, frequent meetings of CERC may be required for the selection of consultants, assessing the progress of the consultancy works, etc. The selection of the Consultant will also be in a phased manner, and frequent meetings of SLTC/SHPSC may be difficult.

Further, as and when the Drone data is provided by the Survey of India, phase-wise RFPs may have to be called for engaging a consultant. Consultants for the preparation of GIS-based Master Plans are to be selected through a bid process via the e-tenders portal of the Government of Kerala. As per the decision of the 1st CERC convened on 04.04.2025, Agenda item No.4, the Government has constituted a Bid Evaluation Committee for the selection of a Consultancy service for the preparation of a GIS-based Master Plan for AMRUT 2.0 Cities vide G.O.(Rt)No.1524/2025/LSGD Dated: 19-06-2025 of the Local Self Government (DC) Department.

During the 1st meeting of the Bid Evaluation Committee held on 03.07.2025, it was decided that, to facilitate frequent meetings, ensure smooth functioning and for enabling timely completion of the AMRUT 2.0 sub-scheme, delegation of powers may be given to Consultancy Evaluation & Review Committee (CERC) for approval of selection of consultant through outsourcing and cost quoted by Consultant for formulation of GIS based Master Plans and later may be kept in subsequent SLTC/SHPSC for ratification. Hence, this matter may be placed before the SHPSC for approval.

14th Recommendation:

- ❖ The Committee decided to recommend to SHPSC for delegating the powers to the Consultancy Evaluation & Review Committee (CERC) for approval of the selection of a consultant through outsourcing and the cost quoted by the Consultant for the formulation of GIS-based Master Plans and subsequent keeping in SLTC/SHPSC for ratification.
