Minutes of the 38th State High Powered Steering Committee (SHPSC) of AMRUT-1.0 Chaired by the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Kerala, on 27th October 2025

Subsequently, as per letter no. 1736642/2025 dated 17.10.2025, letter no. 1449115-2025 dated 17.10.2025, and letter no. 1370948/24 dated 22.10.2025, the Secretary, Kollam Corporation, reported the following regarding the procurement of Amphibian Vehicle, Mobile Septage Treatment Unit and Suction Cum Jetting Machine:

1) Amphibian Vehicle:

Reason for Procurement: The primary goal is to enhance the cleaning operations within Ashtamudi Lake by efficiently removing aquatic weeds (like water hyacinth), floating debris, plastics, and other pollutants. The introduction of this vehicle will significantly improve the ecological health, water quality, and aesthetic appeal of the lake. Its amphibious capability is crucial for reaching shallow, marshy, or otherwise inaccessible areas that are difficult to clean with conventional marine vessels.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Amphibious Operation - the vehicle is equipped with six wheels for land travel and a hydraulic propeller for water propulsion, allowing it to transition easily from land to water without the need for ramps or cranes. Waste Collection - it is fitted with a hydraulic arm with a minimum reach of 2.5 meters and a rotation of 270°, providing a wide operational range for gathering and lifting waste. Lifting Capacity - the hydraulic arm has a lifting capacity of at least 560 kg at its minimum radius and 380 kg at its maximum radius. Working Depth - the arm must operate effectively up to a working depth of 1.3 meters to address both surface and near-surface waste.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The amphibious vehicle will be operated by trained municipal staff or outsourced operators under the supervision of the Health and Engineering wings of the ULB. An Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for 5 years will be entered into with the supplier to ensure regular servicing and timely repairs. Subsequently, maintenance will be handled by in-house staff with periodic servicing from local authorized dealers. Operation and maintenance costs will be met from the ULB's annual maintenance budget, supplemented by user charges or specific allocations under municipal funds.

2) Mobile Septage Treatment Unit:

Reason for Procurement: The procurement of the Mobile Fecal Sludge Treatment Unit (MTU) is a critical step towards improving the septage management infrastructure within the ULB limits. The MTU provides a flexible and efficient solution for on-site treatment of fecal sludge, reducing the environmental and health hazards associated with improper disposal and transportation of untreated septage.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Under the Kollam Corporation's Annual Plan for 2025-26, an amount of ₹50 lakh was allocated for the purchase of one MTU. Following the completion of the tender process, the ULB entered into a contract with M/s. Bhouma Envirotech on 02.08.2025. The vehicle was successfully delivered and commissioned on 14.10.2025.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The MTU will be operated by trained municipal staff under the direct supervision of the ULB's Health wing to manage septage treatment across various zones. An Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for 5 years will be entered into with the supplier, M/s Bhouma Envirotech or through open tender, to ensure regular servicing and timely repairs. Following the AMC period, maintenance will be managed by in-house staff with support from authorized service providers. All costs related to the operation and maintenance of the MTU will be met from the ULB's annual maintenance budget and other relevant municipal funds.

3) Suction cum Jetting Machine:

Reason for Procurement: To effectively and hygienically manage the cleaning of sewer lines and

septic tanks, the Corporation requires a modern, high-capacity Suction cum Jetting Machine. The key feature of this procurement is the integrated mobile monitoring application, which will ensure transparency, track cleaning operations with geo-tagging, and generate daily and monthly reports. This will improve accountability and service delivery for sanitation works.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: The proposed system has a total capacity of 6000 L, comprising a 4000 L sludge tank and a 2000 L water tank. Key specifications include:

- Vehicle Chassis: TATA 1216 LPT or an equivalent model, Suction Unit: Equipped with a Jurop DL 150 vacuum pump or equivalent.
- Jetting Unit: Features an imported Pratissoli/UDOR pump with a minimum flow of 130 LPM and a 60 m thermoplastic jetting hose.
- Monitoring System: An integrated mobile application (Android App) for work monitoring with GPS tracking, photo verification of work, and automated report generation. This includes a minimum one-year subscription.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The vehicle will be operated by trained municipal staff under the supervision of the Corporation's Health and Engineering wings. The supplier will be required to provide a mandatory one-year (12 months) warranty from the date of supply. Following this period, the ULB will enter into an Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) with the supplier to ensure the system's longevity and performance. All operational and maintenance costs will be covered by the ULB's annual maintenance budget and other relevant municipal funds.

As per the letter dated 29.10.2025, the Secretary Kollam Corporation, requested the following reduction in the proposed amounts for the additional works based on current market rates and the required technical specifications:

- Amphibian Vehicle (1 no.): Reduction of the amount from ₹7.50 Cr. to ₹7.00.
- Suction Cum Jetting Machine: ₹2.60 Cr. to ₹0.88 Cr.

2) Procurement of 500 L Mini Jetter cum Sucker Machine for 1 MLD STP (1 no.):

Reason for Procurement: To remove the blockage in network & spillage of sewage through manholes and to make city clean on smaller roads (1.5 m to 2 m width roads). This can also be used on main roads in the morning time during heavy traffic to remove the blockage immediately, while sucking can be done through the larger machine during the night time.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: To remove the blockages on smaller roads (1.5 m to 2 m width roads) where the larger machine can't enter and for usage during heavy traffic.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The supplier has provided a driver cum operator for 1 year and in the meantime will train the ULB workers.

3) Procurement of 100 KV & 15 KV Generator for 1 MLD STP:

Reason for Procurement: To keep the STP working during long power cuts especially in rainy seasons.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: 100 KV is proposed to replace the present 25 KV installed for the main plant as this can't cater for all the plant equipment. The existing 25 KV can be utilized for one pumping station and the new 25 KV can be utilized for the other.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The generator will be procured under and will be maintained by the O&M company.

Mini Backhoe Loader Cum Excavator:

Reason for Procurement: The Alappuzha Municipality is a low-lying, coastal ULB with a dense network of canals, backwaters, flat terrain, and frequently heavy rainfall. The ULB frequently faces multiple challenges like water-logging, storm water drains blockage, damage to roads from monsoon rains, silt accumulation in canals, breakages of pipelines in roads, and delays in maintenance works due to lack of suitable mechanized equipment. To improve service delivery, for faster response, and reduce dependence on external hiring, a Mini Backhoe Loader Cum Excavator is proposed to be procured as a multipurpose equipment.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: The ULB requires equipment to undertake various civil, maintenance, drainage, solid waste management, and restoration tasks across the city, wards, and the low-lying backwater zones. Given the unique topography, soil conditions, road infrastructure, and service demands, a Mini Backhoe Loader Cum Excavator with a loader capacity of 1 to 1.1 m³ and backhoe bucket capacity of 0.25 to 0.27 m³ has been selected. Many narrow roads, local lanes, alleys and canal sides cannot easily accommodate large heavy equipment. Bridge load limits, weak foundations, and flood affected roads further restrict the weight/size of machines. Hence an equipment of the afore-mentioned capacity has been selected.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The ULB will ensure efficient operation and sustainable maintenance of the Mini Backhoe Loader Cum Excavator through a structured team-based approach, regular monitoring, and transparent cost control mechanisms. This will enable the ULB to deliver faster and more reliable civic services, particularly in flood-prone and infrastructure-sensitive areas. All maintenance and operation cost will be met by the ULB.

Agenda Item No.38.4.11: Implementation of Urban Planning Reform under SSASCI 2025-2026 – GIS-based Utility Mapping of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Storm Water Drainage Network in AMRUT Phase-I Cities:

Background:

Under the Urban Planning Reforms of the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SSASCI) 2024-2025, GIS-based utility mapping of water supply, sewerage, and storm water drainage networks was one of the identified reforms. As part of the reform implementation, the State had submitted GIS shapefiles of utilities mapped in 9 AMRUT cities — water supply networks in the nine AMRUT cities, sewerage networks in Thiruvananthapuram and Kochi, and storm water drainage networks in Thiruvananthapuram, Guruvayur, Palakkad, and Kozhikode. Based on the submission and compliance with reform requirements, the State has received an incentive amounting to ₹5.50 Cr. under SSASCI 2024-2025.

In continuation of the scheme, under Part X – Urban Planning Reforms of the SSASCI 2025-2026, GIS-based utility mapping of water supply, sewerage, and storm water drainage networks on the GIS portal and the PM Gati Shakti portal has again been identified as one of the key reforms. The objective of this reform is to enhance resource management, mitigate environmental impacts, and enable data-driven decision making for efficient urban infrastructure planning.

As per the eligibility criteria prescribed by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), the State must map/digitize the existing water supply network, storm water drainage, and sewerage network layers on the final GIS base layers created under the AMRUT GIS Sub-Scheme or any other Government scheme/initiative. All networks should be created on a GIS platform and publish all the GIS utility maps on PM Gati Shakti Portal. The GIS structure and content should adhere to the design and standards published by MoHUA.

The eligible incentive for this reform is ₹3 Cr. per city, to be released on a pro-rata basis (₹5.50 Cr. will be deducted). The available utilities in the cities are as follows:

Proposal:

In line with the implementation of the reform, the utility mapping of Water supply, Sewerage and storm water drainage has to be done for 9 phase 1 AMRUT cities through empaneled accredited agencies of the State, who have prior experience in utility mapping.

The key deliverables and outcomes envisaged in the proposal are as follows:

- City-wise geospatial database of 9 cities.
- GIS layers (shapefiles, Geo TIFFs) for water bodies, drainage, and KWA assets.
- Condition assessment reports and asset metadata in standardized formats.
- Interactive Web GIS Dashboard for planning, monitoring, and decision-making.
- Training and handover to KWA and ULB officials for sustainable operation and maintenance.
- Establishment of a future-ready, data-driven asset management system aligned with AMRUT 2.0 and Smart City Mission objectives.

The estimated cost for the GIS-based utility mapping activity is **₹10,93,74,083**.

Source of Funds:

AMRUT Phase-I projects are scheduled for completion by December 2025, and balance funds are expected to remain available under the Mission. It is proposed that the cost for the GIS-based utility mapping be met from the balance funds of AMRUT Phase-I.

The proposal was placed in the 33rd SLTC held on 08.10.2025 and the committee decided as follows:

1) Water Tanker (3 nos.):

Reason for Procurement: To address water distribution needs in areas where pipeline coverage is inadequate or during water supply interruptions. This will ensure the timely delivery of potable water to residents and prevent public grievances.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: 4000 L (1 no.): This smaller capacity unit is ideal for navigating congested urban areas where road access is limited. 8000 L (2 nos.): These medium tankers are suitable for water transport to areas with higher demand and high altitude. The combination ensures flexibility and efficiency in meeting diverse water distribution requirements.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The water tankers will be operated by licensed drivers from the ULB's fleet section under the supervision of the Health Wing. Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for 5 years will be entered into with the supplier. After that, these will be maintained by in-house staff with periodic servicing from local authorized dealers. The operation and maintenance costs will be met from the ULB's annual maintenance budget, supplemented by user charges or specific allocations under municipal fund.

2) Floating Excavator (2 nos.):

Reason for Procurement: The renovated canals like the BK Canal require periodic desilting, removal of aquatic vegetation, and cleaning of accumulated waste. Manual cleaning is time-consuming, labor-intensive, and often ineffective in large stretches of canals. Floating excavators will provide an efficient, mechanized solution to maintain the canals in a functional and clean condition.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Medium-sized floating excavators have been selected, suitable for maneuvering in canals of varying widths within the ULB limits. The selected capacity enables efficient desilting and vegetation removal without damaging canal structures.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The floating excavators will be operated by trained municipal staff or outsourced operators under the supervision of the Health and Engineering Wings. Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for 5 years will be entered into with the supplier to ensure regular servicing and timely repairs. After that, these will be maintained by in-house staff with periodic servicing from local authorized dealers. The operation and maintenance costs will be met from the ULB's annual maintenance budget, supplemented by user charges or specific allocations under municipal fund.

3) Bush Cutter (2 nos.):

Reason for Procurement: The renovated parks need regular maintenance to preserve aesthetics, hygiene, and usability. Bush cutters will enable the timely cutting and clearing of overgrown vegetation, thereby enhancing the appeal and safety of public spaces.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Portable, motor-operated bush cutters have been proposed as they are efficient, easy to handle, and can cover different sizes of parks across the city. The selected capacity balances affordability with the required efficiency for regular park upkeep.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The bush cutters will be managed by the municipal park maintenance teams under the supervision of the Health Wing. Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for 5 years will be entered into with the supplier to ensure regular servicing and timely repairs. After that, these will be maintained by in-house staff with periodic servicing from local authorized dealers. The operation and maintenance costs will be met from the ULB's annual maintenance budget,

supplemented by user charges or specific allocations under municipal fund.

1) Procurement of 4000 L Sucker Machine for 100 KLD FSTP:

Reason for Procurement: The 100 KLD FSTP being constructed at Chelora will be ready for commissioning by 31.10.2025. Normally the septic tanks found in the households have a capacity of nearly 2000 L.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: To carry septic waste from at least 2 houses in a single trip.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The supplier has provided a driver cum operator for 1 year and in the meantime will train the ULB workers.

2) Procurement of 4000 L Jetter Cum Sucker Machine for 1 MLD STP:

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Alappuzha has narrow urban and residential roads, especially in densely populated and canal-side areas. A 5000 L tanker offers sufficient capacity for effective water supply support while maintaining good maneuverability and access in congested areas. A 5000 L tank provides a manageable load that ensures vehicle stability and safety during transportation, especially on uneven or waterlogged roads common in Alappuzha during monsoon seasons. The 5000 L capacity represents an optimal balance between water-carrying efficiency, vehicle maneuverability, operational flexibility, and cost-effectiveness, making it the most suitable choice for the ULB's urban and environmental conditions.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: The ULB will manage the operation of the 5000 L capacity water tanker vehicle through a coordinated system with the Kerala Water Authority (KWA) to ensure efficient, equitable, and uninterrupted water distribution, especially during periods of scarcity or service interruptions. A joint coordination mechanism will be established between the ULB and KWA for planning tanker operations. The ULB will deploy the tanker based on KWA's daily or weekly water supply schedules, ensuring complementary rather than overlapping operations. Reason for Procurement: AMRUT project has restored around 100 km of ULB roads and continued maintenance of these roads are required.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Easy to operate type of truck mounted pot hole repairing machine is proposed to be procured.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: O&M of vehicle will be taken up by the ULB's Engineering Dept. through proper channels.

2) Truck Mounted Boom Lift (1 no.), Heavy Duty Wet & Dry Vacuum Cleaner (2 nos.), High Pressure Washer (2 nos.) & Indoor Automatic Floor Scrubber Commercial Driving Floor Cleaning Machine (1 no.):

Reason for Procurement: Skywalk external walls are of 10 m in height. Cleaning the same is a difficult task. Over the roof solar panels are also provided in the Skywalk. Cleaning of these panels is also to be done periodically. So, truck mounted boom lift of 15m height is required. Around 900 m² area is to be cleaned twice a day. So, the proposed floor cleaning equipment are also required.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: Boom lift of 15 m height is proposed to be procured for cleaning

the walls of the Skywalk as it is 10m high and for the cleaning of rooftop solar panels. For cleaning the floor commercial type equipment are proposed to be procured.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: O&M of vehicle will be taken up by the ULB's Engineering Dept. through proper channels.

3) Floating Weed and Garbage Removal Machine (1 no.):

Reason for Procurement: Around 400 km primary drains are present in the ULB with an average width of 6 to 7 m. The proposed equipment is for the continuous cleaning of these drains.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity: The primary drains become filled with weeds every 2 to 3 months. For removing weeds and garbage from the primary drains the proposed equipment is required.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: O&M of vehicle will be taken up by the ULB's Engineering Dept. through proper channels.

4) Water Tanker (3 nos.):

Reason for Procurement: 360 KLD STP at General Hospital produces nearly 200 KLD of reusable water. Only 50 KLD is used on site for landscaping. A portion of the balance quantity can be transported and used for road side gardens in the ULB. The water tankers are proposed to be purchased for this purpose.

Reason for Selecting the Capacity:

Water Tankers of capacity 2000 L (2 nos.) and 5000 L (3 nos.) are proposed so that 5 to 6 trips per tanker can be made each day and at least 1 KLD of treated used water can be reused.

Operation and Maintenance by the ULB: O&M of vehicles will be done by the ULB in the same way as being done for the vehicles of the ULB under the Health Section.
